**CRATER LAKE TO BE NEW MECCA**

Accommodations for Tourists Being Provided in New National Park.

**PERMANENT IMPROVEMENT FOR SIGHTSEERS' BENEFIT**

Camps Being Constructed at the Mysterious Mountain Lake and Along the Road to It—Secretary of Interior Scanning Articles.

With the opening of the tourist season of 1907, about July 15, Oregon will have a new national park, and one of the most wonderful in the world, to offer for the consideration of sightseers. Will G. Steel is preparing to open Crater Lake park with a complete camp and way stations for tourists.

Articles of incorporation for the Crater Lake National Park company have been prepared, and are now in the hands of the secretary of the interior for inspection and criticism. The articles will be filed as soon as passed upon by the department. The company will be capitalized at \$100,000, and construction of permanent improvements will be commenced early next year.

**Getting Ready for Tourists.**  
"For the year 1907 we will rely upon temporary accommodations for the public at Crater lake and along the route thereto," said Mr. Steel. "We will immediately begin construction of a complete tourist camp at the lake, with a first class cook and attendant, to take care of the business that comes this year. Along the route from Medford to the lake we will install way station camps where tourists can stop over night."

"The camp at the lake will be made as comfortable as possible, and it will be our aim to serve good food and give facilities for a first-class outing such as one could expect in the mountains. The camp will be ready by July 15, which is as early as it is possible to get in to the lake on account of the snow."

Crater lake is now for the first time beginning to be recognized as one of the wonders of the world. Scientific men have in recent years been giving the region exhaustive examination, and the origin and cause of the lake is being discussed in public documents. It has been estimated by government geologists that Mount Masama, which formerly towered to the sky where Crater lake now rests in its broken and hollowed crest, was by far the greatest mountain on the western hemisphere.

Mount Masama's destruction and the resultant gathering of the lake in its crater, is one of the fearful mysteries of past ages, which geologists are figuring out by the aid of lava rock and pumice stone found in the region within a radius of 40 miles.

**JUSTICE COURT MAY FALL INTO EXCAVATION**

The east side justice court is reported to be unsafe. It was recently moved toward the river to make room for the large building that will be erected at East Burnside and East First streets by R. A. Frounck, proprietor of the Greenbrier restaurant. The justice court building stands 30 feet above the ground on unsubstantial foundations. The workmen are excavating east of the building and dumping the dirt under the building against the supports, which procedure has proved so disastrous where other fills have been made. A corner support was knocked out the other day in this manner.

Clerk George J. Quinlan considers the building quite safe but Constable Charles Mautz is not quite so sure of its safety. These two men are in the building most of the time.

**SERIES OF STAMPS FOR JAMESTOWN EXPOSITION**

Special Stamps Are to Be Placed on Sale Within Ten Days.

Washington, D. C., April 12.—Announcement is made by the postoffice department that the special series of stamps designed to commemorate the founding of Jamestown will be ready and placed on sale within the next 10 days. The stamps are rectangular in shape, and are of 1-cent, 2-cent and 5-cent denominations.

The 1-cent stamp contains, in a semi-circular frame, a portrait of Captain John Smith. In the upper corners are medallions of Pocahontas and Powhatan. Upon the scroll is the legend: "Founding of Jamestown, 1607," and on the base, "Captain John Smith," with the years of his birth and death—1580-1631.

The 2-cent stamp contains a picture depicting the landing of the settlers at Jamestown in 1607. On the one side is a tobacco plant and on the other a stalk of Indian corn. Underneath, on a scroll, are the words: "Founding of Jamestown, 1607."

**COLLEGE TEAMS DISCUSS GOVERNMENT OWNERSHIP**

Washington, D. C., April 12.—That the interests of the people will be best subserved by the government ownership and control of interstate railroads was debated this afternoon by teams representing George Washington university

and the University of North Carolina. The contest took place in the Belasco theatre and attracted a large crowd of auditors. North Carolina supported the affirmative and George Washington university the negative side of the question.

Athens, Ga., April 12.—The annual debate between representatives of the University of North Carolina and University of Georgia takes place here this evening and promises to be one of the most interesting events of the college year. Georgia has the affirmative and Carolina the negative side of the proposition: "Resolved, That the ownership and operation of interstate railway lines by the government would subserve the best interests of the people of the United States." This is the tenth debate between the two institutions. Out of the nine that have been held the University of North Carolina has won six.
