The car was filled with people at the time of its mad flight. Richard, a clerk of the Ferris stock company, had two ribs broken and was bruised. Florence Stone (Mrs. Richard Ferris), the leading woman at the Auditorium, sustained bruises, and a nervous shock. In demonstrating what his car could do, William Reuss had a previous occasion driven up the incline at Chutes park, where the boats slid down and had turned it around and brought it back all right, stopping at the edge of the place where the boats make their leap into space and land on the water. On this trip he induced the theatrical people to accompany him. He climbed the incline all right and started down, but something went wrong. By the time the car was half way down, Reuss had all the brakes on and the power reversed in an effort to stop the car's progress, but nothing availed. The passengers were rescued with difficulty.
