Why have you estimated the average value for right of way to be \$480 per acre? Commissioner Prouty asked.

Right of way for the north bank line cost from \$40 to \$1,000 per acre, and is not all bought yet.

Value of Terminals. It was brought out in his testimony that in estimating the Great Northern's Spokane terminal grounds for ordinary real estate use he would value it at only \$1,400,000.

Increase in Seattle. Ex-Governor John H. McGraw of Seattle was called to the stand to testify as to the present value of Great Northern terminals in Seattle.

Spokane's attorney stated that Spokane real estate is supposed to be valued at about 60 per cent for taxation purposes.

WHAT BIG ROADS COST

Interesting Information Comes to Light at Rate Hearing.

In documents filed as evidence in the Spokane rate case yesterday afternoon it was alleged by the Northern Pacific Railroad company that the loss of revenues to the company from June to December, inclusive, last year, had terminal rates been put in as desired by Spokane, would have amounted to \$1,200,000.

Westbound Interstate traffic delivered at Spokane in 1905 amounted to 123,145,000 pounds of carload lots and 16,607,000 pounds of less than car lots.

The Great Northern submitted tables showing that in June, a representative month for the year in freight business, its interstate freight deliveries at Spokane were 5,489,483 pounds, yielding a revenue to the road of \$90,483.

What Cascade Tunnel Cost. In an examination of A. H. Hogeland, chief engineer of the Great Northern, many interesting facts as to the cost of railroad construction on the northern coast were brought out.

The total cost of rebuilding the Great Northern system as it now stands would, it is alleged by Mr. Hogeland, be approximately \$415,167,616.

Extension to Columbia Slough Road Is Sought by Property Owners.

Laying of steel rails began this morning on the new line of the Portland Railway, Light & Power company from East Twenty-eighth street out the Sandy road to the eastern boundary of Rose City Park.

The entire grade of the line has been completed except for a few hundred feet through the hill in the park. General Manager Fuller is pushing the work on this extension as fast as possible and expects to be operating cars on the line not later than July 1.

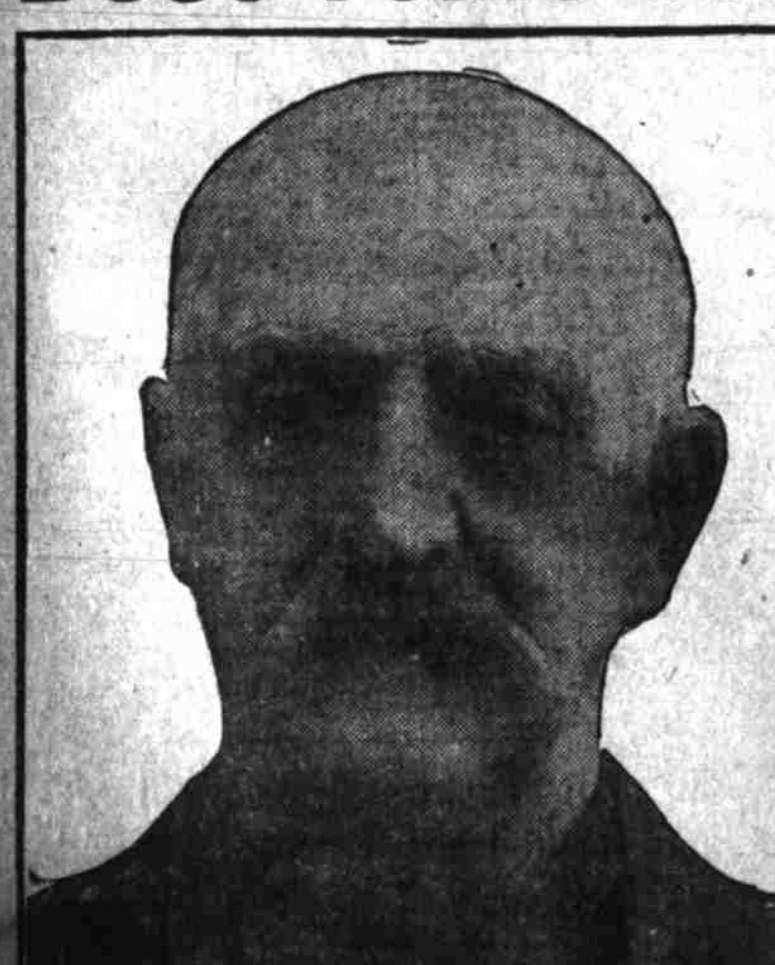
