

In Oklahoma it is stated that fully 95 per cent of the oats crop has been ruined by the bug's visit.

GREEN BUGS EAT LIFE OUT OF THE WHEAT CROP OF CALIFORNIA

Damage reports continue to come from the far southwest and for this reason the wheat market was even stronger than the quotations at the end of yesterday's session showed. The advance was trivial compared with the importance of the damage reports, it being stated that the crop of Okiahoma would not amount to more than 25 percent of the normal one and that other states of the southwest were in almost as bad a position.

OVAL ACUALITION

Prospects for Good Crop of Grain and Much Better Quality of Fruit.

Wheat crop conditions in the Pacific northwest and especially in Oregon bromise a very good yield this season. Weather conditions at this time are favorable to the fall sown wheat and spring operations are under full sway. Too much moisture is complained of in some sections, but this is the time of the rear when warmer weather can always be expected so this trouble is not considered very bad.
