NEW YORK'S THEATRES DURING WEEK

NEW YORK, April 26.—At Wallack's theatre, Margaret Mayo's version of Victorian Bardou's "Divorçons" was produced on Monday night in which the star appeared in the part of the captivating and capricious Cyrienne.

Though "Divorçons" was written more than 20 years ago, this comedy in three acts is so modern and up-to-date in theme, and the translation so cleverly made, that the average theatre goer would think it a production of today. "Divorçons"—as the title suggests—has to do with the subject of divorce. Cyrienne is the beautiful and charming young wife of a middle aged genius, who is all absorbed in his inventions and is rather eccentric.

As time wears on the wife realizes that she is being neglected and seeks consolation in the attentions shown her by a young officer in the forestry department of the government. The husband allows Cyrienne every latitude and she, womanlike, comes to realize that there is little of romance in an affair of this kind when it is not forbidden, but has the full sanction of her husband and his perfect confidence in her forces her to realize him an extraordinary manner of man and she literally falls in love with her own husband.

Miss George has most excellent opportunities in this role to shine to perfection. Her girlish, youthful figure and comedy talent lend themselves admirably to it.

This is the second New York engagement this season of the "Divorçons" having appeared for a long engagement early in the winter at the Manhattan theatre in "Clothes."

Barnum & Bailey.

With the performance of next Saturday night, the engagement of Barnum & Bailey's circus will come to an end. The well balanced performances this year made an instant hit and in consequence the immense Madison Square Garden has been crowded at every performance and gained its usual popularity. Surely nothing more enjoyable in the way of a circus program has ever been offered before.

The circus is especially strong in riding acts, male and female riders vying with each other in their rivalry. Josie De Mott, Emma Bradua, the Swiss equestrienne, and the Meers Sisters, repeated their former sensational success.

Manhattan Opera House.

Mr. Oscar Hammerstein for the last week of grand opera at the Manhattan opera house has provided an opera for every night in the week and Saturday matinee. "Carmen," "L'Alcazar," and "La Navarraise." This is a week of no end of farewells for the artists.

Monday Verdi's "Rigoletto," with Miss Finken's Glilda and Mr. Bonas as the duke and Mr. Lammarco in the title role, was again produced with all its splendor and sublime music and repeated its former triumphs.

Wednesday Madame Demida made her farewell in the role of Lady Henrietta in "Martha," with Madame de Clueteros and Bonel. "I Puritani," which opened the season at this house, has been chosen for Friday night as the farewell of Mr. Campanelli, the brilliant leader of the orchestra.

Saturday night "Aida" will be sung by the same list of singers which has won success in its 11 previous performances.

This winds up a most remarkably brilliant and successful, both financially and artistically, first season of this popular house of grand opera, and Mr. Oscar Hammerstein as an impresario and manager has won new laurels and covered himself with glory.

Joe Weber.

After a brief tour on the road, Joe Weber and his all-star stock company returned to town on Monday for a week's engagement at the Grand Opera House. Weber has always been a popular favorite on the west side and he and his most excellent company, the same which appeared at his cozy little Broadway theatre, "The Magic Knight" were the offerings. Cecilia Loftus, Lillian Blauvelt, Lillian Lee, Eunice Mackay, Joe Weber and Otis Harlan are in the cast.

Plays That Stay.

"The White Hen," at the Castpo with Louis Mann, is still running along merrily. There have been no changes in the musical numbers and the addition of the imitations, which have proven so successful, has given an impetus to the comedy, such as has seldom been attained by similar performances.

"The Man of the Hour" is in for a very long run at the Savoy and this fact was made evident by the signing of papers last week whereby Messrs. Brady and Grismer signed their contracts for the renewal of another year with Frank McKee of the Savoy theatre, providing for the continued production at this playhouse.

The special matinees on Thursdays at which Miss Frances Starr is appearing at the Helasco in "Rose of the Rancho" have proven so successful that Miss Starr has decided to continue them throughout the season.

On Monday night "The Road to Yesterday," recently seen at the Herald Square, was produced at the Lyric theatre. It will continue its New York run. The cast is unchanged. The principal roles are being played by Miss Minnie Dupres and Robert Dempster.

"The Prince Chap," after a 19 weeks' tour on the road, was brought back to the Madison Square theatre on Monday night by Cyril Scott. This play, by Edward Peple, started last year with a long run at the Madison Square theatre. Cyril Scott has played the title role more than 400 times without losing a performance. He will retire permanently from the play at the end of the season.
