KANSAS PROHIBITION LAWS TO BE ENFORCED

Topeka, Kan., April 24.-Injunctions against nine foreign brewing firms restraining them from owning or operating saloons in this state have been secured by Attorney General Jackson. He also obtained an order that a receiver be appointed to take charge of the property of the brewers. The receiver will sell the property and the proceeds will be used to defray the expenses of enforcing the prohibition laws of Kansas, which they have violated.

THEATRICAL RATES ON ROADS OPEN TO PUBLIC

Commerce Commission Rules on Party Rate Tickets-Must Be Open to All. (Journal Special Service.) Washington, April 24.-Party rate tickets heretofore sold by the railroads to theatrical troupes only, must be given to all parties of proper number seeking for them, according to a ruling of the interstate commerce commission. The commission was not unanimous in the ruling. Commissioners Knapp and Harlan dissenting. The majority opinion, delivered by Commissioner Prouty, said: "We are unable to see how the carriage of 10 persons belonging to an amusement company as a party differs from the carriage of 10 other persons as a party in the same train at the same time and between the same points, and we are of the opinion that the party rate ticket must be open to the public in general."
