District Attorney's Office Will Investigate Signing of De Veny Petitions.
SOLICITORS CHARGED BY ANGRY CANDIDATE
Milkmen Lays Blame on Otto Prag, Declaring Himself to Be Innocent, and the Liquor Association's Secretary is Also Involved.

Deputy District Attorney Adams will investigate the charges that Otto Prag and John Milkmen forged signatures to the nominating petitions of William De Veny and W. G. Davis, two candidates for controller at large whose petitions were thrown out by Auditor Devlin.
Dr. De Veny took his petition and contention to the district attorney yesterday and charged that the two men who had circulated the petitions had written in false signatures themselves, thus invalidating the petition and putting him out of the race.

"Such accusations," he said in discussing the matter, "should be sent over the trail."
Dr. De Veny will take it as his duty to see that he is not out of the city and has not yet made any statement regarding his future course.
