CLEAR CHANNEL IN SNAKE RIVER

Government Engineers Will Start Important Work in a Few Weeks. CONTRACT FOR BARGES LET TO LOCAL BUILDER.

Stearwheel Steamer Will Also Be Constructed at Early Date to Be Used in Connection With Government Improvement Work on Snake.

Improvement of the upper Columbia Snake river will be commenced at the earliest possible day. A contract for the construction of three large derrick barges has been let to Joseph Supple and bids for a stern-wheel steamer to ply on the Snake in connection with the work will be opened here soon.

A great deal of work is being done in the several shipyards about the city. One that was closed some time ago to have the channel made navigable from the upper Columbia to Lewiston and now the work is to be taken up in earnest. The barges are to be completed in 30 days. They will be built at Rupert, whither Mr. Supple will send a big gang of ship carpenters. The stern-wheel river steamer will also be built there.

The new steamer Weovon will be launched this afternoon at the St. John shipyard. The vessel has been constructed under the personal supervision of Captain Smith and contains the boiler and engines of the old steamer Regulator, which was burned at that place January 24, 1906. She will be used for towing.

PREVENT BOMBARDMENT

Ordinance May Prohibit Gun Tests in the Harbor. It is probable that an ordinance will be proposed to prohibit vessels from testing their life line firing guns in the harbor as a result of the incident of yesterday when the crew of the steamer Costa Rica bombarded the city, the projectile narrowly missing some laborers.
