ORCHARD STATISTICS OF STATE OF WASHINGTON

(Special Dispatch to The Journal). Tacoma, Wash., May 8.—State Horticulturalist F. A. Huntley's annual report shows there are 28,697 acres of orchards in this state in fruit orchards, of which 15,888 acres was added during the past year. The horticultural industry is increasing at a tremendous rate. Pierce county leads in the culture of berries. The commercial orchards of the state contained at the beginning of last year 2,772,195 apple trees, 949,292 plum and prune trees, 748,254 peach trees, 500,683 pear trees, 242,453 cherry trees, 20,589 apricot trees, 23,853 English walnut trees, 15,185 almond trees, and 6,988 quince trees. The trees planted last winter and this spring have not yet been enumerated.
