

TRAVEL NORTH OF ARCTIC CIRCLE IN 30-FOOT BOAT

W. A. Reid and Wife Visit Icebound Alaska Region in Frail Craft Where the Temperature Stands Eighty-Two Degrees Below Zero.

Twenty miles north of the Arctic circle in a 30-foot gasoline launch is the trip W. A. Reid, representative of the army department of the international committee of the Y. M. C. A. in Alaska, made in company with Mrs. Reid to visit mining camps and various military posts and telegraph stations along the great Yukon river last year. Mr. Reid is in Portland visiting at the Y. M. C. A.

No other craft of like dimensions or character ever penetrated so far north and Mr. Reid told many stories yesterday of the adventurous times he and Mrs. Reid had in the frozen country with the thermometer registering as low as 82 degrees below zero. To see horses and dogs drop dead because of the terrible cold was an ordinary sight, while men crazed by the stillness and solitude of the great, silent white wilderness was no less common.

Live Together Without Speaking.
Fort Yukon was the point farthest north that the staunch little craft with her crew of two reached, although many places were visited where Mr. and Mrs. Reid carried on their work of placing libraries, distributing literature, holding services and giving lectures. At each of these places the voyagers planned organizations and left the work in the hands of the committee, who carried on the work in the winter months.

"One significant fact in the north," said Mr. Reid yesterday, "is the number of men whose minds are affected by melancholia. They have lost all sense of reason because of their isolation and live alone from one another in their sultriness. At one place we visited there were only three men, yet they were not on speaking terms and lived as separately as if they were miles apart."

"Each man would get up in the morning, prepare his own meal, wash his own dishes, make his own bunk, tend to his own business and have nothing to do with either of the remaining two. Yet they were living in a post miles from other camps and were not able to see any human beings save themselves. Coming down the river we saw 20 men whose minds were so affected by melancholia they were being brought down to be placed in asylums."

"We traveled 2,100 miles in the launch and 3,900 miles by steamer and overland, or a total distance of 6,000 miles. We held services on our little craft and entertained 644 visitors on board on our trip."

The launch used by Mr. and Mrs. Reid is called the Helen Gould, in honor of the financial sponsor of the work which Mr. and Mrs. Reid are carrying out. The vessel, however, was not donated by Miss Gould, but was paid for out of subscriptions made by business men of Portland, Seattle and other Pacific northwest cities.

Mrs. Reid was formerly an Oregon girl and was married to Mr. Reid last year. Her maiden name was Miss Emma Schibrede and she is a daughter of Judge C. H. Schibrede of Coos bay. Mr. and Mrs. Reid will return to Alaska in three weeks to again make the northern trip.

SPEEDWAY OF BASE LINE ROAD

Residents Will Convert Thoroughfare Into Auto Drive by Packing With Oil.

FUNDS RAISED TO MEET NECESSARY EXPENSES

Petroleum Sprinkler Will Be Brought From California and Highway Put in Shape This Season for Horses and Automobiles.

Property owners and residents along the Base Line road have decided to oil the highway and make it a boulevard and speedway for automobiles and driving horses. The arrangements to bring about this scheme are about complete and the road will be put into the finest of shape for the approaching summer.

George Bamford of East Forty-fourth and Base Line, representing the property owners, is now completing everything for the actual work of preparing the surface and putting on the oil. The funds have been raised and the expense estimated. A sprinkler with which to lay the oil will be secured as soon as possible.

A sprinkler can be rented from a local implement firm, but the machine must be brought here from California. The implement firm will not bring the machine to Portland unless some one will purchase it if it gives satisfaction. The property owners on the Base Line have raised the amount necessary to rent the machine for the summer, but do not feel that they can buy the machine after that time, so they will ask the city or county to buy it.

Councilman Frank S. Bennett will present the matter in various ways and means committee Monday and he expects favorable action. He says there are many fine drives around the city that could be made free of dust in the summer and free of mud in the winter if the city oiled them. Such drives as the Willamette and Columbia boulevards are among these and there are many more.

Mr. Bamford and his neighbors have figured that the cost of oiling the Base Line road will be but \$175 a mile, while now it costs \$400 a mile every year to keep it in shape.

FIVE THOUSAND FOR GAUGING OREGON STREAMS

(Washington Bureau of the Journal.)
Washington, May 8.—The director of the United States geological survey has recently certified to the state engineer of Oregon that there has been set aside from the appropriation made by congress for gauging the streams and determining the water supply of the United States the sum of \$5,000 for the maintenance of gauging stations in the state of Oregon, during the calendar year ending December 31, 1907. Inasmuch as the Oregon state legislature has authorized the state engineer to expend a similar sum upon this work, the total fund available insures the continuance of the valuable observations of stream-flow that have been carried on in the state, in spite of the fact that congress at its last session reduced the federal appropriation for this work by \$3 per cent.

The investigations will be in charge of J. C. Stevens, hydrographer, United States geological survey, whose headquarters are at the Tilford building, Portland, Oregon. The gauging stations regularly maintained are well distributed over the state and are designed to secure data concerning available water supply for irrigation, water power, public supply, etc.

The geological survey announces that the investigations of underground water that have been carried on during the past year in Lake and Klamath counties in southern Oregon are nearly completed and that a report upon the same will soon be forthcoming.
