### WEATHER REPORT.

Storm southeast warnings were ordered displayed at 8:30 p. m. yesterday at all airports from Cape Flattery south to Tillamook for a moderate storm which made its appearance yesterday afternoon off the Washington coast and which this morning is central over British Columbia. The following maximum wind velocities occurred last night: North Head, Washington, 68 miles southeast, and Tacoma Island, Washington, 60 miles southeast. The storm has broken the long drought in this section, and general rains will occur today, tonight and tomorrow throughout the north Pacific states. A snow disturbance over the lower Mississippi valley has caused heavy rains in that section, and at New Orleans the excessive amount of 4.64 inches fell in the last 24 hours. The high pressure area over the Canadian northwest has advanced southward to Minnesota, and abnormally low temperatures continue in the Missouri and upper Mississippi valleys.



plant is a 16-mile logging road into the mountains. Timber tracts at the end of the road are said to have cost the owners about \$1,000,000.  
There is now under construction in Silverton a \$20,000 brick schoolhouse, besides two other brick buildings. There is not an empty dwelling to be had in the city, while many new ones are being erected.  
A Sunday train service is desired and needed at Silverton, as well as at other places along the Woodburn-Springfield branch. Although there are now prospects that the service will be estab-

lished the inhabitants along the line are growing impatient on account of the delay.


