

JANGLE WITH DEVILINTES

Scheme to Keep Friends of the Republican Ticket in Front of Opened Registration Books Next Week

Ugly rumors are afloat regarding the plans of the Devil machine to colonize the north end vote during the time the registration books are open on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of next week and force the bona fide residents of the city who may desire to place their names on the books into second place or entirely beyond any chance to meet the requirements of the law.

It is intimated that a scheme is on foot to round up the north end denizens at different lodging houses in the district and hold a large "floating population" there in the interests of the Republican ticket. The story was that the workers in that district have already massed a considerable number of men and will have them in line when the books open ready to be first on the lists.

This line will be reinforced continually throughout the time the books are open, thus attempting to shut out many bona fide residents who may desire to register. Lane leaders will keep a strict watch on all registrations, however, and will see that no illegal voter is allowed to cast his ballot on election day.

Unregistered Vote for Lane.
The Democratic managers are anxious for every qualified voter in Portland to be on the registration books and will aid in the registration of all legal voters not now registered. Those residents of the city who fail to register and vote are in the majority of cases men who have become politically inert on account of past machine rule in Portland. They are men who, if taking any part in any election, would cast their vote for a clean city and a decent administration.

Lane leaders are confident, therefore, that the unregistered vote will be a Lane vote if it is brought to the polls. They are anxious therefore that the full legal vote of the city be registered.

Need to Be Let Out.
Chairman Calk and the Republican Central committee will assume entire official management of Mr. Devlin's campaign the first of next week. 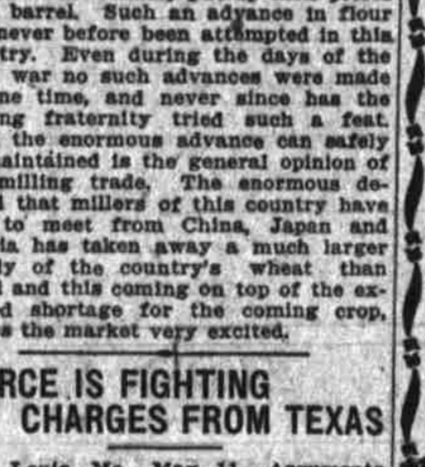
