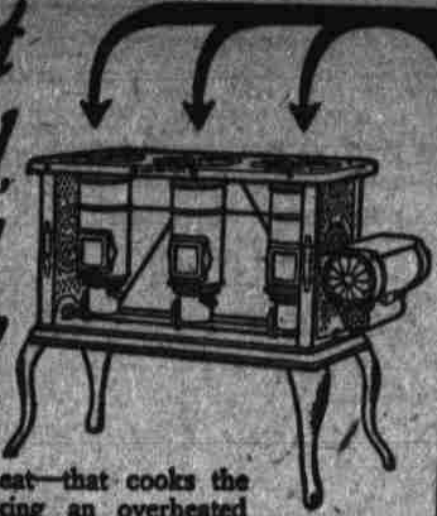

All Universities and Learned Societies of Sweden Holding Celebration.

OBSERVE ANNIVERSARY OF FATHER OF BOTANY

Just Two Hundred Years Since Birth of Carl von Linné, Who Placed the Knowledge of Plant Life on a Scientific Basis.

(Journal Special Service.) Stockholm, May 23.—All the universities and learned and scientific societies of Sweden today held exercises in celebration of the 200th anniversary of Carl von Linné, the father of the modern science of botany.

Interior Oregon Would Like to Connect With Corvallis & Eastern.

LET THIS BE EXTENDED TO SUMMIT, THEY SAY

Then With Heavy Freight Outfits Products of Interior Now Locked Up May Reach Markets—Water Carriage Possible in Connection.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Albany, Or., May 23.—The management of the Corvallis & Eastern railroad is considering the advisability of extending the eastern branch of the road to the summit of the Cascades, a distance of about 25 miles.

A good portion of the desired Corvallis & Eastern extension is surveyed and many miles are graded. It would be a comparatively easy undertaking to renovate the roadbed and lay the rails.

The residents of eastern Oregon propose to establish a road leading to the terminal of the railroad as extended, and through the use of heavy freight wagons convey their products to this point and thence have them carried to the markets by rail.

The lands of eastern Oregon are just beginning to come into prominence, and with the development of that section a business will be built up that will demand consideration of the transportation companies of the state.

COPPER STREAMS RUN OUT OF HOODOO ROCK

New Finds in This Idaho District Excite Even Coeur d'Alene Experts.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Hoodoo, Idaho, May 23.—Samples of ore from the surface showing discovered last week have been smelted and a large lump of pure copper obtained from each sample.

A Matt, a mining man of many years' experience in the rich Coeur d'Alene district, who has been here investigating for several days, says:

"I found in the shaft of the Mispah property 25 feet of excellent shipping ore. This is a better showing than I have ever seen in the Coeur d'Alene so near the surface. The formation is very similar to that of the Coeur d'Alene and the ledge looks as if it would retain its value with depth.

Another rich copper and gold property is the Gold Bug. The owners of this famous mine are nearly all residents of Palouse and Garfield, Washington.
