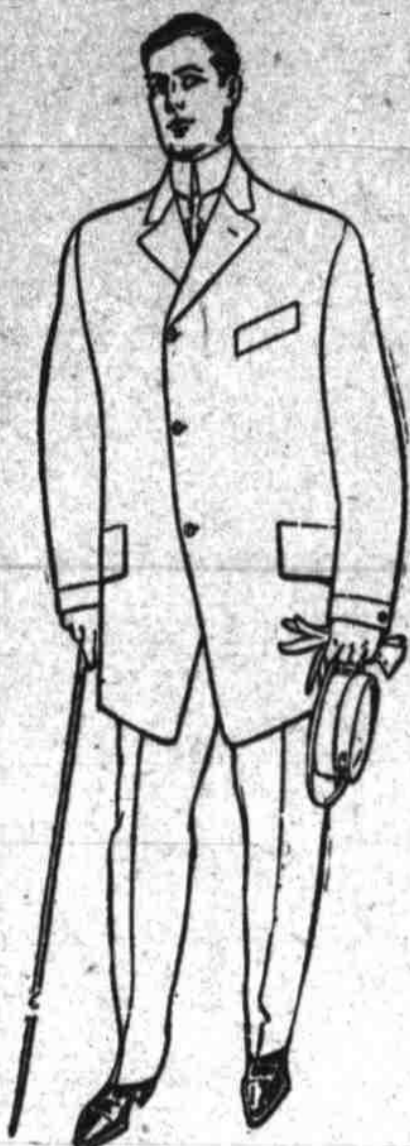

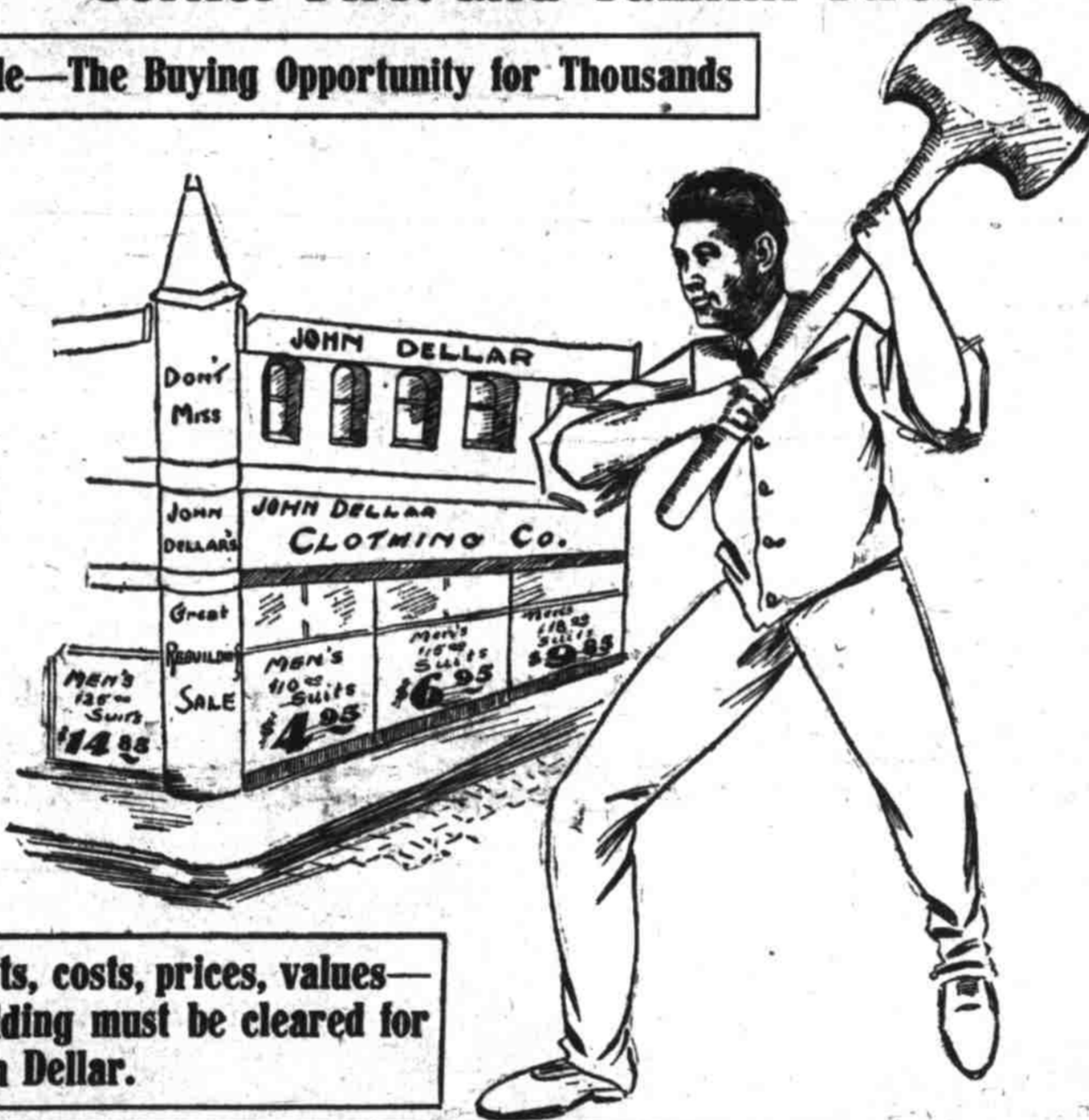

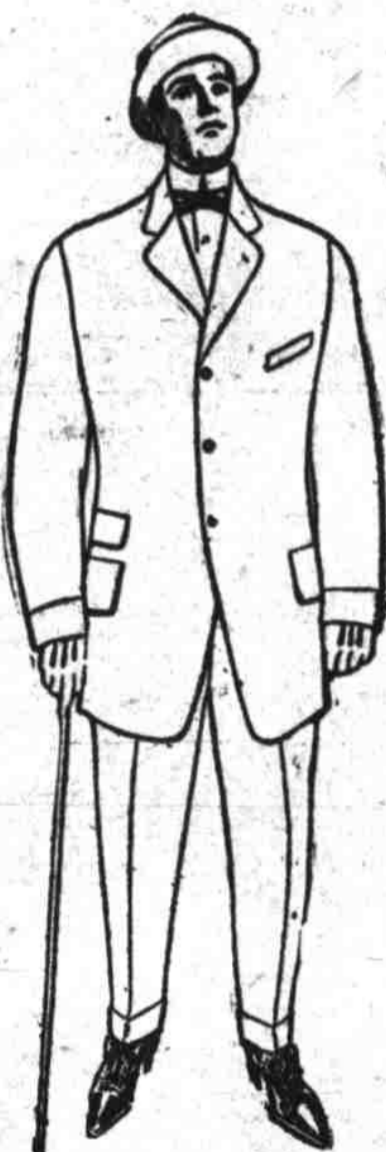

Terryville, Conn., May 30.—A memorial gun in honor of Dorence Atwater, who rendered the nation valuable services by preserving the list of dead at Andersonville prison during the civil war, was dedicated here today with interesting exercises. Miss Clara Barton, founder of the Red Cross and a co-worker of Atwater, was the guest of honor and the oration of the day was delivered by Judge Joseph Sheldon of New Haven.
