COSTS MUCH MONEY TO PRODUCE BEST WOOL SHARP

Special Dispatch to The Journal. Pendleton, Or., June 7 .-- Acis not the only cause for the increased cost of wool. It costs the woolgrower 75 cents a head to winter sheep, 7 cents to run it on the forest reserve in the summer, 3 cents for dipping, 13 cents for shearing and \$45 a month for a man to herd.

The shearing of sheep is no small profession. A shearer at the Love shearing plant in Baker county has just sheared 104 head of sheep in a forenoon, and in nine hours he had sheared 189 head. Computing this at 13 cents a head, which is the price paid, the man received \$24.57 for his day's work. The professional shearer starts in California and follows the season clear into Wyoming, getting probably four months' work. He does not work the remainder of
