Opening Prices on Columbia River Salmon Are Formally Announced Today - Five to Fifteen Cents Advanced

WHEAT HAS OPENED

Values About as Predicted by The Journal Nearly a Month Ago.

Today's market features: Formal opening of salmon prices. The situation promises to be a very quiet one.

Formal Opening of Salmon Prices. Columbia river packers have announced their opening values on salmon after many weeks' delay to see what the prospects were for the catch.

One-pound tails... \$1.07, \$1.00. One-pound flats... 1.75, 1.90. One-pound ovals... 1.05, 1.00. Half-pound ovals... 1.50, 1.40. Nominals... 2.50, 2.40.

These prices are practically the same as those announced by The Journal May 10, the only exception being that the tails opened at a higher price than was predicted for nearly a month ago.

At the time of The Journal's announcement of what the opening values would be, there was much comment among packers. Some contended that prices should be no higher than a year ago.

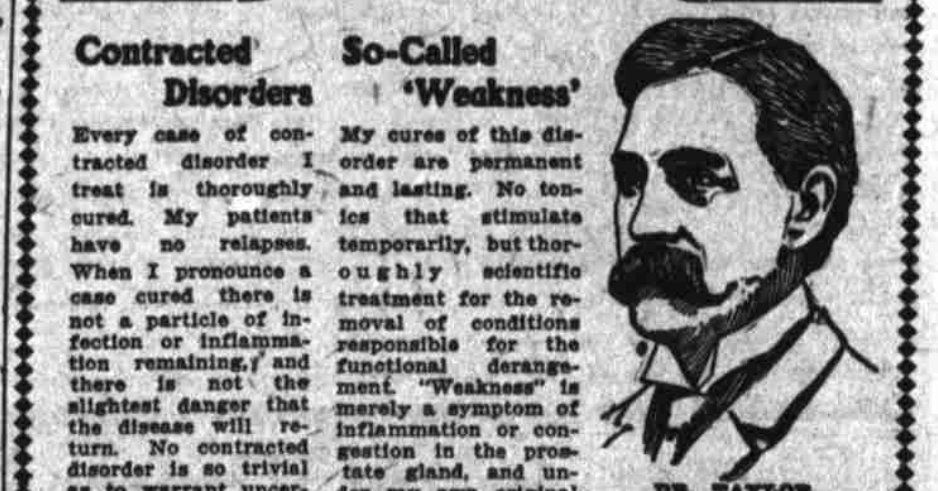
