# AT COOS BAY

Three Millionaires Back of the Phenomenal Building Activity-One of Largest Sawmills in State Being Erected.

Three millionaires-C. A. Smith Minneapolis, Henry Hewitt of Tacoma and Louis J. Simpson of North Bendare doing things for Coos BBay. A lumber mill with a daily capacity of 250,-000 feet, said to be the largest in Oreis being built by Smith at Marshfield. A new gas and electric light plant and electric railroad is to be built by Hewitt and Simpson at North Bend and Marshfield, where Simpson is al-ready largely interested in various in-

dustries.

J. E. Oren, general manager at Marshfield for C. A. Smith, is a Portland visitor today, and registered at the Portland hotel. He said work on the new lumber mill is being pushed, and the mill plant will be completed as rapidly as the extensive plans will permit. There will be a sawmill, a planing mill and a box factory.

Employ Four Mundred Men.

The piling for the sites is being driven, and the framing for the buildings is being sawed out. A foundation for the office structure is being laid. When the plant is completed it will give employment to about 400 men. C. A Smith is expected to arrive next

give employment to about 400 men. C. A. Smith is expected to arrive next week from Minneapolis to inspect progress of the work.

Mayor L. J. Simpson, of North Bend, who is at the Portland, said conditions at the bay are favorable for steady growth and improvement and that population is increasing. The city councils of North Bend and Marshfield have granted a franchise for an electric light plant to be built by Hewitt and Simpson, and at a meeting last night a franchise for gas was expected to be passed. The city of North Bend has granted franchise for the proposed electric road, and Marshfield is expected to grant a franchise to the company.

"As soon as these matters are shaped up we will commence work on gas, electric light and electric railway plants," Mr. Simpson said.

A strong movement is on foot in the bay towns to improve transportation conditions. Large sums have been subscribed toward building an electric road between Roseburg and Coos Bay. A petition is now before the Oregon railway commission for reduction of rates on the Coos Bay, Roseburg & Eastern railroad. The merchants of the bay are cooperating in an endeavor to improve and add to steamship service between Portland and coast points. The people are anxiously awaiting some sign of revival of the Harriman project to build an extension from Drain to Coos bay.

Capitalists Trying to Pek Up Loose Stock to Realize Big Benefits.

New York, June 19.—Efforts of persons supposed to represent dominant stockholders in Wells, Fargo & Co. to

stockholders in Wells, Fargo & Co. to purchase minority holdings of stock, coupled with the 200 per cent extra dividend of the Adams Express company, gave rise to the report that the Wells-Fargo management was contemplating similar distribution of assets.

It is known that agents have canvassed the country from Maine to Californis in search of any lots, however small, of Wells-Fargo stock, offering to pay \$300, the current market price. Since there is no contest for control, it was argued that the only reason for this action was the decision of the management to make a special distribution to stockholders.

A financial statement made by the Wells-Fargo management last year, when the contest of control was on, showed that \$12,674,690 of the total assets, amounting to \$20,771,600, was in demand loans, and contesting stockholders complained that this large amount of loans was for the personal convenience of Edward H. Harriman. It is believed that since then these demand loans have been changed to security investments.
