EUGENE MERCHANTS DEMAND NEW TRAIN

Eugene, Or., June 21.—The Eugene Merchants' Protective association has forwarded to the Southern Pacific officials a set of resolutions demanding a local train service between Eugene and Wendling and between Eugene and Coburg and Natron. Two trains each way per day between the city and Wendling and one each way to Coburg and Natron is asked for. The officials promised to inaugurate such a service a long time ago, but failing to move in the matter the merchants are taking it into their own hands.

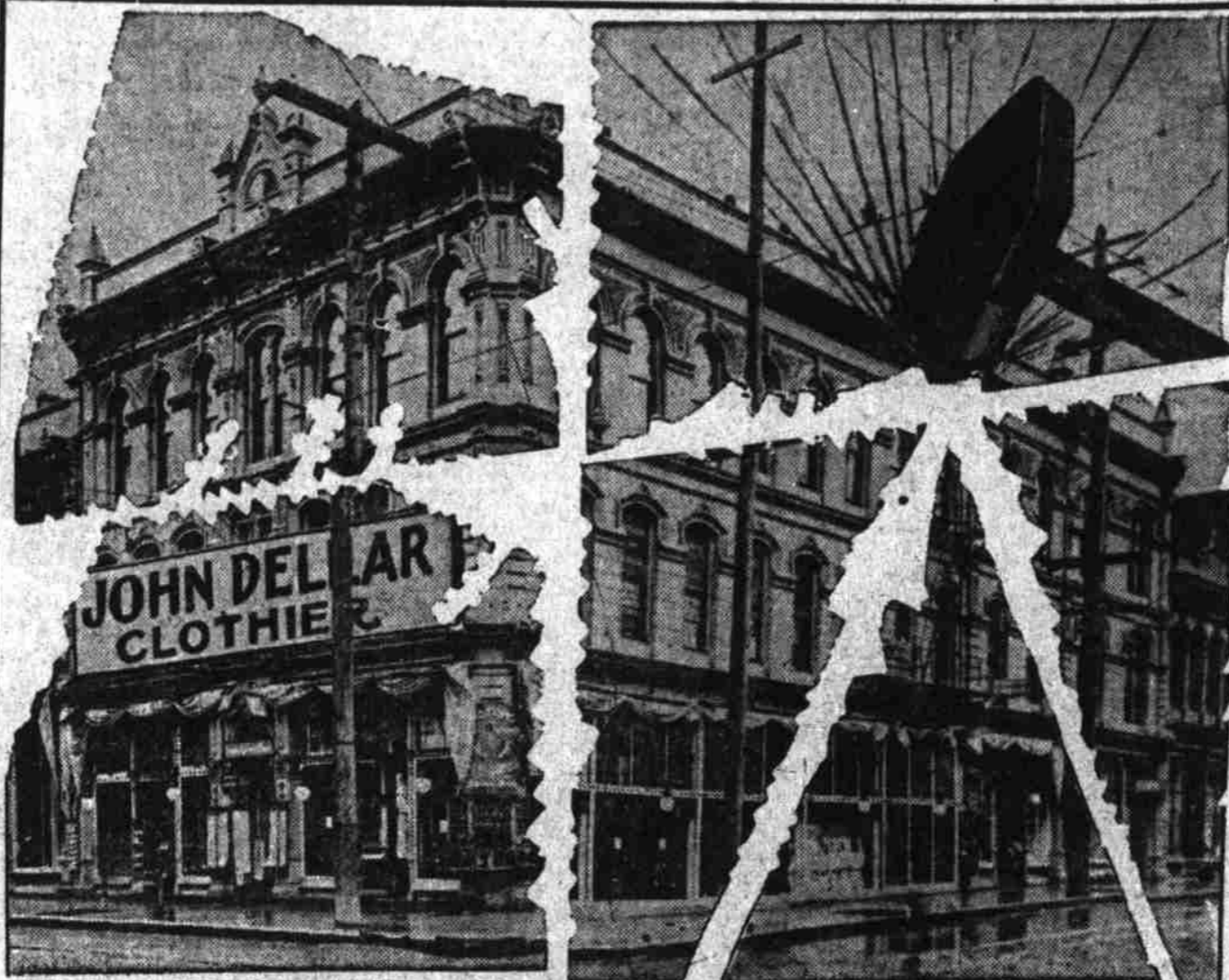
