

RAILROADS UNABLE TO SHIP LUMBER PRODUCTS

Harriman and Hill Systems Next Door to Failure in Handling Traffic.

LINES NOT ABLE TO SUPPLY CARS ENOUGH

In Interstate Commerce Hearing, Country Has Opportunity to Learn Something of the Business Done by Lumbermen in Northwest.

(Washington Bureau of the Journal.)
 Washington, June 21.—Official Washington was given some astonishing statements when counsel argued here before the interstate commerce commission for their clients in the case involving the through joint rate via the Portland gateway, asked for by Puget sound millmen, on forest products originating in western Washington. Official Washington—and through it the nation—learned that western Washington and western Oregon alone cut annually 17 per cent of the entire output of sawed lumber in the United States, and that nearly 90 per cent of the shingles supplied to the middle west come from the north Pacific coast; that something like 150,000 to 175,000 carloads of forest products annually is the freight originating in the two north coast states; that the gigantic railroad systems comprising the Northern Pacific, Great Northern, Chicago, Burlington & Quincy, O. R. & N., Southern Pacific, Union Pacific, Oregon Short Line, has been utterly unable to move more than one third of this traffic; and that enough sawed lumber and shingles lie in mill yards in the north coast to load to engine capacity thousands of trains hauled by eight-driver mountain "hogs."

Railroads Near Failure.
 It was brought out that shingle mills had needed 2,500 cars more than they could obtain from the railroad serving them, and that to such proportions had north coast traffic grown that the boasted transportation triumphs of the Hills, Harrimans and Goulds is to be spelled "near-failure."
