### WEATHER REPORT

Reports are again missing this morning from all stations east of the Rocky mountains. The barometer is relatively high over the north Pacific states, and relatively low over California and Arisona. During the last 24 hours showers have fallen in northern Nevada and at scattered places in eastern Oregon and central Idaho. It was much warmer yesterday afternoon in Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Utah, but this morning the temperatures on the Pacific slope are generally slightly below normal. mal.

Indications are for fair weather in this district tonight and tomorrow. It will be warmer east of the Cascade mountains, and continue warm in western Oregon and western Washington.
