

THOUSAND NEW CARS FOR COAL

Northern Pacific Officials Promise. No Famine This Winter.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Tacoma, Wash., June 28.—One thousand new coal cars are being delivered to the Northern Pacific railroad by car manufacturers of the east and officials of the road here say there will be no repetition in the northwest of the coal famine of last winter, or for that matter along the entire line. Nevertheless, L. B. Richards, superintendent of transportation of the road, with headquarters at St. Paul, who is here, says the growth of traffic on the system is producing such a congestion that people will have to secure their coal early this summer. J. C. Roth, the newly appointed superintendent of transportation of the Northern Pacific, will assume the duties of his new office July 1.

LARGE FEE FOR BEING RECEIVER

Ninety Thousand Awarded by Court for Handling Insurance Affairs.

(Journal Special Service.) Chicago, June 28.—Nearly \$90,000 has been awarded the State Bank of Chicago and Attorneys Fosh and Hamill for services as receiver and attorneys for the Traders' Insurance company, which collapsed as a result of the San Francisco disaster, leaving liabilities of \$1,022,000. Orders directing the bank as receiver, to take \$40,000 for its services and pay \$50,000 to the lawyers representing it in litigation, which followed the crash, were entered by Judge Honors in circuit court. The affair caused a stir among the thousands of policyholders who have claims of \$4,000,000 against the defunct corporation. Judge Honors' orders provide that the receiver make payments at its earliest convenience. The policyholders, however, were awarded a dividend of

60 per cent by the court, and the money probably will be paid out by the receiver within a few days. The attorneys representing the policyholders, whose money has been tied up in the courts for more than a year, are prepared to contest the fee awarded to the receiver and counsel.
