Captain Simmey came up from Knappton this morning to arrange for having the vessel towed here and docked. He is anxious to have it done as soon as possible.

The Alumna has been engaged in the coastwise trade but was thrown into the foreign market when the San Francisco famine came. She carries nearly 1,000,000 feet.
