MANEUVERS MOST SUCCESSFUL YET

Oregon Citizen Soldiers Are Home From Forts Stevens and Columbia.

SUCCESS GREATER THAN ANTICIPATED

Officers Highly Pleased With Results and Express Belief That Beaver State Troops Outrank All Coast State Soldiers in Proficiency.

After one of the most successful maneuvers ever held by the state militia the Oregon National Guard returned from Forts Stevens and Columbia last night.

The detachments at Seaside which were sent by the state are expected to return this afternoon and may be in at 4 o'clock.

After the third day's tactics Captain Knapp said the Oregon boys were able to handle the guns just 10 seconds behind the regular troops.
