

WEATHER REPORT

A shallow low pressure area occupies the South Pacific states and a small disturbance is central porth of Montana. A small ridge of relatively high pressure extends from British Columbia south and east to the Dakotas, and a large high pressure area overlies the Atlantic and Gulf states. During the twenty-four hours ending with this report light rains fell in extreme northern Oregon, Washington, Montana and the port light rains fell in extreme hordern Oregon, Washington, Montana and the Canadian northwest and at scattered places in the eastern and southern states. It is warmer in Oregon, southwestern Idaho, Arizona, central colorado and eastern Nebraska, and cooler in north-eastern Washington and British Colum-bia. Elsewhere the changes in temperature have been small and unimportant.

Indications are for generally fair weather in this district tonight and temorrow.
