WEATHER REPORT.
 The barometer pressure rose decidedly
 over the western portion of this fore-
 cast district during the 12 hours en-
 dued with this report. Clear skies pre-
 vailed in consequence, except along coast,
 where a few clouds were reported.
 Thunderstorms occurred in southeastern
 Idaho and in western Montana accom-
 panied by light rain. In the interior of
 precipitation was either entirely absent
 or was appreciable. Temperatures in
 western Oregon and western Washing-
 ton were cooler, and in the interior of
 the maximum at Portland reaching 91
 degrees at about 3 p. m. Shortly after
 that hour, however, the temperature be-
 gan to fall rapidly under the influence
 of the northwest breeze that sprung
 up at that time, and at 5 p. m. the tem-
 perature had fallen to 81 degrees. De-
 cidedly cooler weather prevailed in
 southeastern Idaho, but elsewhere no
 marked thermal changes occurred.
 In the interior of the Pacific coast
 in this district today, it will be cooler
 except near the coast.
