280 CARS IN ONION CROP STOCKS EASIER TO RISE THAN FALL

President Fanno of Confederated Growers' Association Tells of Yield. Conditions of Market Significant Rather Than Its Transactions.

PESSIMISM HAS BEEN VASTLY OVERDONE
State of Affairs Really Better, Beyond Question, but Improvement in Market More a Proper Recovery Than a Fresh Advance.

Onion Crop Statistics.
Probable yield 1907 280 cars.

While it is yet rather early for the making of estimates of the onion crop of Oregon for the year 1907, I believe that the production will run close to 280 cars, against 298 cars a year ago.

At this time the onion fields are invaded by lice and mildew, and this will somewhat affect the production. However, I feel that the estimate will not run far from that of a year ago. The acreage in onions this season is 470 acres, against 475 acres a year ago, just five acres being cut out from the total planted a year ago. This was at Hillsboro.

While the output of onions will not be much less than a year ago, there will not be near so much stock offered in the open market. A hundred and five acres of onions were contracted for seed by California seed growers. Quality of the onions will likely be quite good, but much will depend upon weather conditions of the near future.

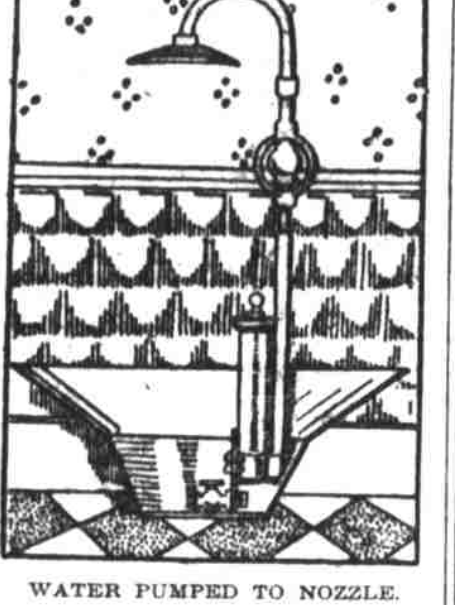

Electro-magnets are much used in connection with cranes and other conveyors for lifting heavy pieces of iron and steel.

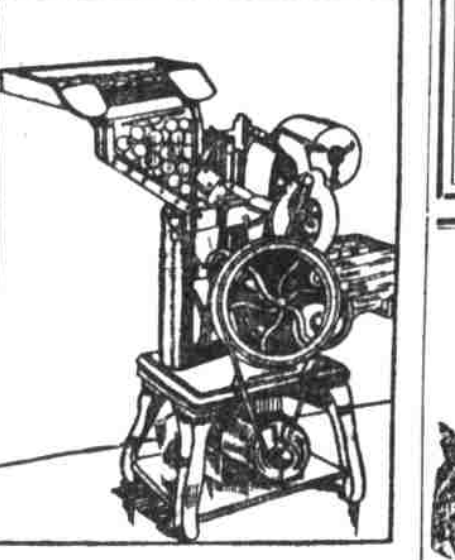
PORTABLE BATH
