The drydock is to be located at the Puget sound navy yard at Bremerton. The navy department has fixed today as the date for examining bids for the construction of the work, and it is planned to complete it without any unnecessary delay. The dock is designed to be the largest in the world and will be able to float battle-ships larger than any of those now in existence or planned. The couple have been married about two years and have one daughter. They have frequently been mentioned as among the happiest royal couples of Europe.
