WEATHER REPORT

The British Columbia disturbance has crossed the Rocky mountains and now extends as a trough of low pressure from Alberta south to eastern Colorado. The barometer continues relatively low over Arizona and a new high pressure area has made its appearance off the central California coast. A high pressure area is also central over the lake region and the barometer in the gulf states continues relatively high. During the 24 hours ending with this report good rains fell along the north California coast and in Oregon and Washington west of the Cascade mountains. Fair weather prevails generally throughout the eastern states, except in the lower Missouri valley, where light to moderately heavy rains have occurred. It is cooler in Oregon, southern Idaho, and eastern Washington, while elsewhere the changes in temperature have been small and unimportant. Indications are for showers tonight and tomorrow in western Oregon and western Washington and for generally fair weather east of the Cascade mountains.


