INDIAN MORTAR IS FOUND BY WORKMAN

Relic of Stone Age Uncovered in Earth at Salem by Paul Rhodes.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Salem, Or., Aug. 15 .- An Indian mortar, which probably belongs to the stone age, was unearthed in the excavations for the new addition to the McCornack building yesterday by a workman by the name of Faul Rhodes. This was found at a depth of six feet seven inches and was embedded in hard earth. The mortar resembles certain others of the same kind found in the Umpqua valley and now in the collection of the Willamette university, only this is perfect and the others are broken and have certain parts missing. The specimen found yesterday will weigh at least 20 pounds and will hold several pints. It is four inches deep in the inside and the bottom is about two and a half inches thick, making a total depth of six and a half inches. It is not altogether circular but slightly oval, about five and a half inches in the narrowest place and about an inch more in the widest. The surface is comparatively smooth and has apparently been ground to this condition with some hard rock of the same kind as the specimens in the Willamette collection. age, was unearthed in the excavations
