### NEW TRAIN ON HUNTINGTON RUN

O. R. & N. Will Accommodate Passengers From Oregon Short Line.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)  
Pendleton, Or., Aug. 22.—Reports have reached Pendleton from La Grande that arrangements are being made there for the extra passenger train from Huntington to Portland, which will be put on by the O. R. & N. by the first of September or soon thereafter.

It is authentically reported that extra train crews have been ordered from La Grande to run between Huntington and Portland, new uniforms have been ordered, and all necessary preparations are now under way.

This is in spite of the fact that the Portland morning paper of Monday contained an interview with General Manager J. P. O'Brien denying that an extra train would be put on and saying that there was no demand or need to make connections with the Idaho train at Huntington.

The Oregon Short Line is now running a local train from Salt Lake City to Huntington, and passengers are required to wait several hours in Huntington to get the O. R. & N. train out, which is causing much complaint, and next month when the rush of home-seekers comes in it will be almost impossible to handle the traffic under present conditions. Trains from the east are now crowded to their utmost capacity.

Assurance of this additional train means much to eastern Oregon, especially when the colonist influx begins. Pendleton has made a hard fight with this end in view, but the officials say that the train over the O. R. & N. is directly responsible.

### TEACHERS WILL STUDY FARMING

Pedagogues Will Attend the Session at Corvallis Institution Next Week.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)  
Corvallis, Or., Aug. 22.—The summer school in agriculture begins at the Oregon Agricultural college next Monday and continues six days.

Specialists in the various branches of agriculture will give lectures of special interest to public school teachers, who will be the one primarily benefited by the course in this line.

The lectures will be supplemented by demonstrations and exercises of a practical nature in fields, orchards and laboratories to illustrate the principles taught.

The principal object of the summer school is to assist the public school teachers in the country and to prepare themselves for teaching agriculture in the seventh and eighth grades of the public school, as by law now required.

**Text Book Inadequate.**  
The text book on agriculture which has been adopted for use in Oregon schools was prepared for general use throughout the country and as agricultural practices vary greatly in different sections it is impossible for the book to cover the requirements of all states. The instructors will therefore indicate where modifications may be made advantageously in the text, having in view the needs of the teachers and pupils of the public schools of the state. The following is a list of subjects to be treated by the agricultural faculty of O. A. C.: "Animal Husbandry and Forage Crops," Dr. James Withycombe; "Insect Pests and Plant Diseases," Professor A. B. Cordley; "The Plant and School Gardens," Professor E. R. Lake; "Soils and Plant Food," Professor A. L. Kniesly; "Flowers," Professor George Lewis; "Farm Dairying," Professor F. L. Kent; "Bacteriology," Professor E. F. Pernot; "Poultry," Professor James Dryden.

In addition to the above there will be special lectures as follows: "Domestic Science in the Public Schools," Mrs. Clara H. Waldo; "The Outlook for Industrial Work in the Public Schools," Superintendent J. H. Ackerman; "The Place of Agriculture in the Commercial School," President W. J. Kerr of O. A. C.

In addition to the foregoing, addresses will also be delivered under the auspices of the County Teachers' Institute by Governor Chamberlain, Senator Fulton and others. There is no tuition for the summer school work.

Former President of Drain Normal Will Accept Eastern Oregon Position.

Pendleton, Or., Aug. 22.—At a meeting of the school board, Professor A. E. Briggs, late president of the Drain normal school, was chosen as principal of the Pendleton High school for the coming year. He was elected at a salary of \$1,200 per year, which is an advance of \$200 over the salary formerly paid, and the selection was made from a number of applicants.

When Professor Harrison resigned several weeks ago, it was feared the board would have difficulty in getting a competent, capable man so late in the season. However, Professor Briggs, owing to the uncertainty of that position's future, at this meeting of the board Miss Lila Keller of the city was elected to fill a vacancy, which now completes the faculty.
