MAINTAINS POSITION.

for Europe, as Will Also a Coal- Portland Leading Wheat Exporting Port on Pacific Coast.

Portland is maintaining its position as a wheat and flour shipping point of prominence despite the fact that the month of July was light on account of

month of July was light on account of a shortage in the supplies, and indications are for a still more prominent position among the leading ports by the end of the fiscal year since everything points to unusually heavy shipments of breadstuffs this fall and winter.

As a wheat shipping port the Oregon metropolis holds third position for the seven menths ending July 31, New York and Philadelphia leading, the former with 8.495.011 bushels, and the latter with 4.468.476 bushels, while Portland exported 2.570.888 bushels. Galveston holds fourth position with 2.998.270 bushels, and the Puget sound cities, meaning Beattle, Tacoma and Bellingham combined, come fifth with 2.292.698 bushels. Thus it will be seen that Portland has practically no rival on the Pacific coast when it comes to a question of wheat exports.

The total wheat shipments for the seven months specified above amounted to 29,169,869 bushels as compared with 15,936,374 during the corresponding seven months of the preceding year.

15,986,374 during the corresponding seven months of the preceding year. During the same period of time, this year, 8,870,014 barrels of flour were shipped, as compared with 7,595,442 barreis in the seven months during 1906. New York led the way, Portland holding fourth place, the ricative positions being as follows: New York, 1,841,613 barrels; Puget sound ports combined 1,739,348 barrels; Philadelphia, 1,229,628 barrels; Portland, 972,709 barrels.
