LARGE STEAMER TO LOAD WHEAT

Jethou Will Carry Immense Cargo to Ports in Orient.

SEVERAL VESSELS FIXED FOR WHEAT

French Bark Gael Will Come Here From Puget Sound to Load Wheat for Europe, as Will Also a Coal-Laden Bark From Australia.

Preparations for handling the immense wheat crop that will pour to tide waters from the interior wheat belts are now under way here in earnest and vessels are being picked up in quick succession to carry away thousands upon thousands of tons of grain.

Several transactions closed today go to show that from the start things will be active at the local docks. Foremost among these was the charter of the French bark Gael to carry wheat to the ports of the Orient.

The law governing the steamboat inspection service provided for a fine of \$500 for an offense of this character, but the fine in this case, if imposed, will probably be remitted since the accident is believed to have been unavoidable.

MAINTAINS POSITION. Portland Leading Wheat Exporting Port on Pacific Coast.

Portland is maintaining its position as a wheat and flour shipping point of prominence despite the fact that the month of July was light on account of a shortage in the supplies, and indications are for a still more prominent position among the leading ports by the end of the fiscal year since every thing points to unusually heavy shipments of breadstuffs this fall and winter.

As a wheat shipping port the Oregon metropolis holds third position for the seven months ending July 31, New York and Philadelphia leading, the former with 3,495,911 bushels, and the latter with 4,485,478 bushels, while Portland exported 2,570,888 bushels.

ORIENTAL LINER ARRIVES. Square-Rigger Off River Probably Salmon Carrier.

The Portland & Asiatic liner Numan-tia, Captain Pelman, crossed in at Astoria shortly before noon today and will be up in the harbor tomorrow morning to discharge a large cargo of general cargo and 1,841,000 pounds of salmon across the Pacific in a little over 16 days, which is good time.

The crew and passengers, mostly of whom are Chinese and Japanese, will be brought to Astoria as soon as possible.
