NO ATTEMPT TO RUSH MAIL TRAIN

Government Sacks From the East Held Up Nearly Thirteen Hours.

Merchants who complain about the delayed mails from the east could have learned the reason why the delays occur daily had they been on the train which arrived from the east Tuesday more than 13 hours late.

The Union Pacific which carries the eastern mail from Omaha to Green River, Wyoming, arrived at the latter place on time, switched off the Pullman and mail car to be picked up 90 minutes later by the Oregon Short line train that carries the mail to Huntington, where it connects with the O. R. & N.
Instead of being held but 90 minutes, an ample allowance for connections, the mail car was held 12 hours and 49 minutes. Had the Harriman system shown a disposition to bring the mail in on time a train could have been made up to carry the mail car to Huntington and saved the merchants of Portland a day in their eastern correspondence and business.
All of the delays on the O. R. & N. trains are due to the poor connections at Green River. If the Harriman company wished to serve the public, say the business men, a local train between Green River and Huntington would be put on.
Instead of losing a day, however, in eastern business, Portland merchants

generally lose two, for only once in a great while is the eastbound train from Portland able to make connections at Green River with the Union Pacific at that point. When the train fails to connect on time at Green River, a delay of 12 hours is encountered.
That business men of the Rose City will not put up with poor service much longer is considered certain and a movement may be started to take up the matter with the government in an effort to compel the Harriman people to carry the mails on a better schedule by adding another train between the connecting points.
