It appears to be de-veloping, and light scattered rainfall is reported from Arizona, New Mexico and Colorado in consequence. rado in consequence

The indications point to showers over Washington, western Oregon and north-ern Idaho tonight and Friday and to increasing cloudiness tonight, with probably showers Friday over eastern Oregon and southern Idaho. 
