

WEST DOES NOT KNOW WALL STREET EXISTS

Secretary Wilson Declares Panics Are Not Frightening People on Coast.

(Journal Special Service.) Washington, Aug. 30.—Secretary of Agriculture Wilson returned to Washington after an absence of several weeks in the west, bringing glowing accounts of that section of the country.

"The west is not worrying over future panics or hard times, but is sending money to the east right now," he said. "People out there do not know that Wall street exists, except as they read about it in the newspapers. The grain crops are generally good this year, and less western money is going into Canada than last year."

"There is some fear of another coal famine during the coming winter," speaking of politics Secretary Wilson said: "Everybody I talked to out west was favorable to Roosevelt, and will insist upon the nomination and election next year of a man who will carry out his policies."
