A shallow trough of low pressure overlies the intermountain states and a well-defined disturbance is central near Lake Huron. The bar-ometer is relatively high over the mid-die Mississippi valley. Light to moder-ately heavy rains have fallen in the lake region. Ohio valley and Atlantic states from New York south to Georgia.
