MUST LAY TWO TRACKS OR GET OFF AVENUE

Executive Board Issues Order Regarding Killingsworth Work.

Unless the Portland Railway, Light & Power company takes out a franchise to lay double tracks on Killingsworth and give regular service on that thoroughfare it will be compelled to remove the present single track within 14 days.

This was the order given by the executive board in its meeting yesterday afternoon. The single track on Killingsworth avenue from Union to Grand avenue has been used for switching purposes only, although it is half a mile long.

The city attorney finds that the streetcar company holds no permit on the street and it will be compelled to secure a franchise in the ordinary way.

Water through hose for sprinkling yards or sidewalks or washing porches or windows must be paid for in advance and used only between the hours of 5 and 8 a. m. and 5 and 9 p. m.

SKETCHES OF PORTLAND PASTORS.

Rev. Henry Marcotte, pastor of the Westminster Presbyterian church of this city, was born in Michigan. He attended Lake Forest college at Lake Forest, Illinois, graduating from that institution in 1892 with the degree of A. B. His theological course was taken at McCormick Theological seminary, Chicago, from which institution he graduated in 1896.

Mr. Marcotte's first pastorate was in Astoria, where he labored for seven years and built a new church costing about \$25,000.

He was called to Westminster in 1903 and during his pastorate the membership has increased in these three and one half years 715 new members have recently been added to the church.

Mr. Marcotte is a strong and earnest preacher who is greatly beloved by his loyal parishioners. Westminster church was also noted for its generosity in all mission causes and its cordial spirit toward all who come as strangers.
