TULE LAKE LEASE

Klamath Falls, Or., Sept. 24,-The nited States reclamation service chited States rectamation service as the leased 11,000 acres comprised in the Clear Lake reservoir ste reserve to Ed Brown, the Cornell sheepman, for 11,511, for a term of three years. Bits were submitted to D. W. Murphy, project engineer of the Klamath project at this place, and Mr. Brown was the highest bidder. The only ether hid received was that of the Tule Lake Land & Livestock company. Their bid was \$1,500. This land lies around Tule lake, and comprises the best grazing and \$1,500. This land lies around Tule lake, and comprises the best grating and natural meadow land in northern California. One thousand tons of hay has been cut from the natural meadows surrounding the lake. The possession of this land will give Mr. Brown a great advantage over his neighbors, as he has control of the water also, the land completely surrounding the lake. Water is scarce in that region, but as it is the intention of the present leaseholder to re-let the meadow part of the tract, and all he desires is the range and access to the water for his sheep, no hardanip will be worked on his neighbors.
