NEW MAN SECURES TULE LAKE LEASE

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) Klamath Falls, Or., Sept. 23.—The United States reclamation service has leased 11,000 acres comprising in the Clear Lake reservoir site reserve to Ed Brown, the Cornell sheepman, for \$1,511, for a term of three years. This was submitted to D. W. Murphy, project engineer of the Klamath project at this place, and Mr. Brown was the highest bidder. The only other bid received was that of the Tule Lake Land & Livestock company. Their bid was \$1,500. This land lies around Tule Lake, and comprises the best grazing and natural meadow land in northern California. One thousand tons of hay has been cut from the natural meadows surrounding the lake. The possession of this land will give Mr. Brown a great advantage over his neighbors, as he has control of the water also, the land completely surrounding the lake. Water is scarce in that region, but as it is the intention of the present leaseholder to re-let the meadow part of the tract, and all he desires is the range and access to the water for his sheep, no hardship will be worked on his neighbors. For years the Tule Lake Land & Livestock company has been in control of this water, barring other sheep and cattle-men from grazing in the vicinity.

BERT NUNN DIES OF HIS WOUNDS

Eugene, Or., Sept. 24.—Bert Nunn, the man who killed Charles Crowley in a pistol duel at Marcola Saturday afternoon and who was wounded by a bullet from Crowley's revolver, died at the Eugene hospital yesterday afternoon. He was about 40 years old, and leaves a wife and several children. His parents are at Kingston, Missouri, have been notified of his death.
