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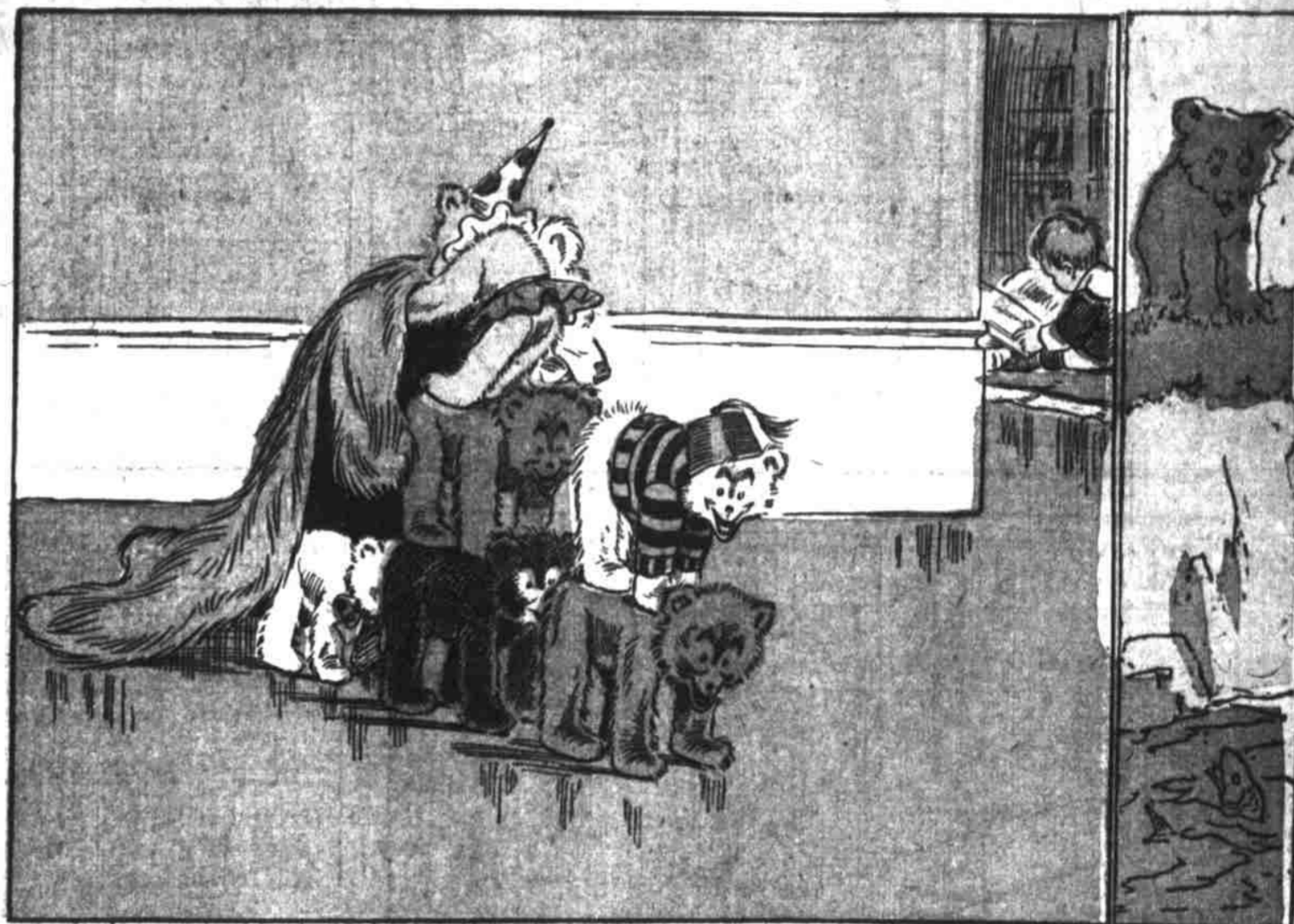

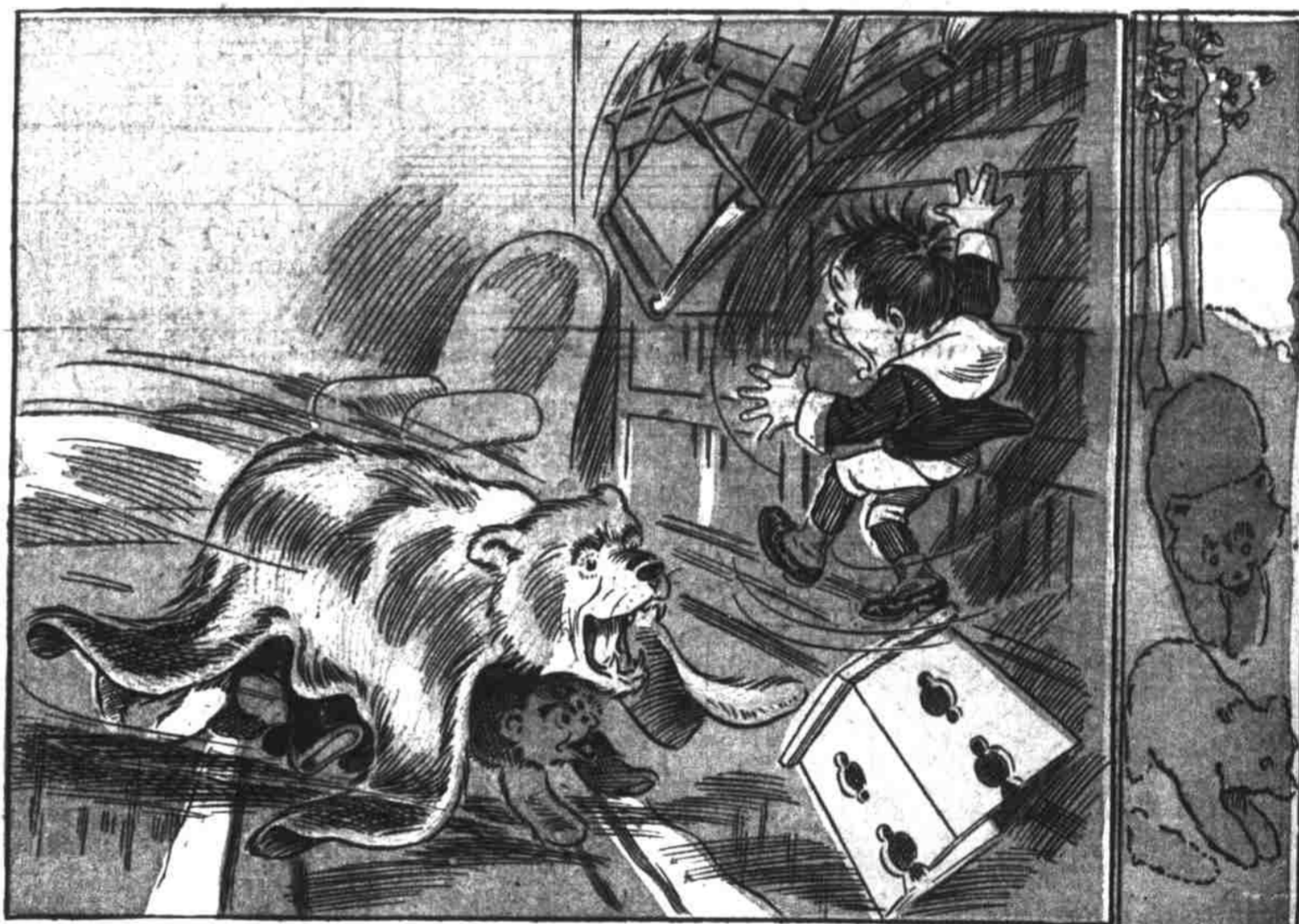
1. See how amused the Teddies look

Will get about some mischief yet.



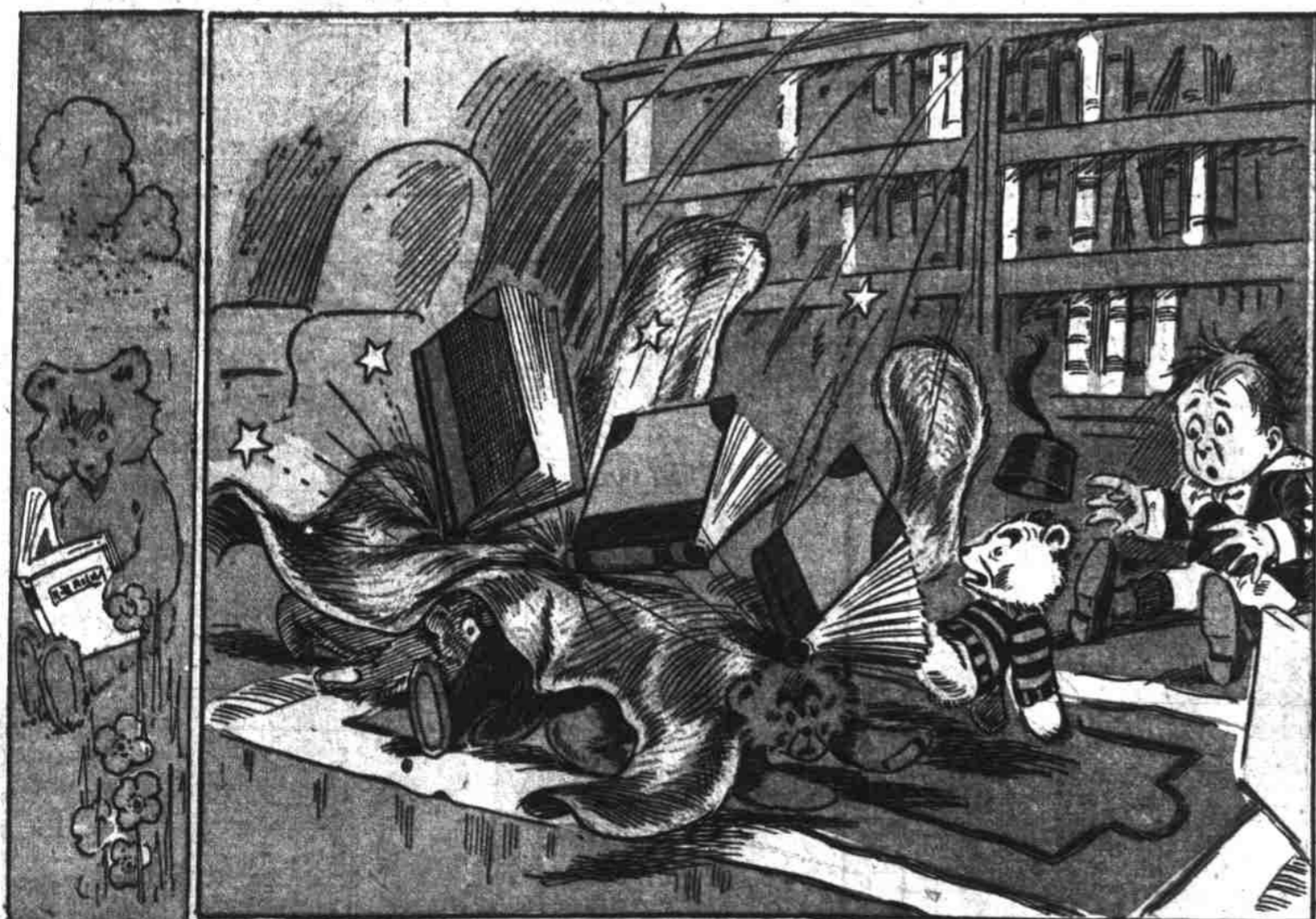
2. And sure enough, inside a minute,
