The storm noted yesterday over Van-couver island moved rapidly eastward, and it is central this morning north of Montana. The following maximum wind velocities occurred in connection with this disturbance: North Head, 52 miles this disturbance: North Head, 52 miles south, and Lewiston 30 miles northwest. This storm also caused general rains in extreme northern California, Oregon, Washington, Idaho, eastern Colorado, Kansas and throughout the Missouri valley. The high pressure area yesterday central over the upper Mississippi valley has advanced to the lower lake region and fair and cool weather prevalls everywhere east of the Mississippi river. It is much warmer in the northern states between the Cascade mounern states between the Cascade mountains and the upper lake region.
