#### WEATHER REPORT

The British Columbia high area is drifting slowly eastward and this morning its crest is about Spokane, Washington. The high area noted yesterday morning over Oklahoma has moved rapidly eastward and is now passing off the Virginia coast. Notwithstanding the great distance that separates their crests, these two high areas overlap, forming a ridge extending from British. forming a ridge extending from British Columbia southeastward to Texas and thence northeastward to the middle Atantic coast. In consequence clear skles prevail over the entire country, except-ng over the upper lakes and extreme south Atlantic coast, where atmospheric disturbances have caused clouds with light to moderate rainfall. with light to moderate rainfall. A trough of low pressure extends along the interior of California, but does not present any of the characteristics of a storm area, and clear skies prevail this morning over the entire southwest. Temperatures were lower over the upper Missouri valley and decidedly higher over the upper Mississippi valley, due to the eastward movement of the Mani-loba disturbance. Fair weather will pre-vall over this district tonight and Thursday. It will be cooler in southvail over this district Thursday. It will be a western Oregon tonight.
