## APPLE MARKET DOING BETTER

### Fractional Advance Noted in Best Packs on Account of Increased Call.

Front street features: Apple market is very good. Easy and well holding. Dressed veal is not so high. More dressed hogs coming. Small Arizona potato trade. Something about the hop trade. Pilot bread is advanced. Bluestem goes down again. Flour sales are heavier. Wheat is advanced 1c. Chickens are in better call. Muscat grapes are in good call. Run of ocean smelt is good.

### Apple Market Is Very Good

A very good time is ruling in the apple market. Demand is growing better every day, and at this time the tone is the lightest of the present season. Supplies are rather faster but the volume does not show up so heavy on account of the improved selling. For strictly fancy four-tier stock, the price is ruling about 1c a box higher. Values today ranging between \$1.50 and \$1.75 for best. Any sort of apple will find a sale at \$1.00 a box today; no matter what the pack is. However, it is the packed stock that finds the best call even at such the best values.

### Some Arizona Potato Trade

A small amount of potato business is still reported from Arizona, which admits of the receivers paying 7c at country points for best quality. The California markets are still too low to admit of any business in that direction. Onions are holding steady locally with no apparent hastening on the part of producers to make sales at this time. Price nominally the same. In the West, however, the arrival of the first California walnuts of the present season's growth. The nuts are of good quality and are finding a demand for them in the market. The amount came in the shipment, this making the price higher than would have been the case had a carload come.

### Eggs Are Just Holding

Taking the aggregated arrivals of local eggs along the front street, the supplies are slightly increased over what they were a week ago. In the market most of the sales reported today are at 32 1/2c, but some are still talking of receiving a higher figure. The larger firms along the street are selling at 32c.

### Chickens are in better condition

One of the most prominent retailers has just finished his new killing house and has the market for supplies the past 24 hours. Today's market is at 12c for mixed. A fractional advance is likely either today or tomorrow in the chicken market on account of the better tone. In a small way some dealers are said to be giving an advance of 1/4c a pound. Supplies are not so liberal. Some cheese is going to the north.

### Creamery butter is cleaning up much better

The market is still burdened with accumulated holdings which were received last week. Some are talking of an advance.
