**SUGAR BEET CROP IS BREAKING RECORDS**

Production Increased By Irrigated Lands — Larger Increase Next Year.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)

Waverly, Wash., Oct. 10.—The big sugar factory at this place has been running since September 18. Under the direction of Superintendent E. A. Kerley, it started out on its fall campaign, and will be making brown sugar from the supply of syrup left over from last year's run until the beets begin coming in, which will be very soon. About 30 men are now employed, but the full force will be put on when the beets are ready to pull and bring to the factory. The factory started earlier than usual this season. Last year it did not operate until October 17.

The best crop this year will be the largest in the history of the country, as hundreds of acres were planted in the irrigated districts, and it is reported they have made a splendid growth, and will yield not less than 20 tons to the acre.

ROAD OFFICIALS MAY BE SENT TO PRISON

Officers of Santa Fe Are Suspected of Having Committed Perjury.

(Pacific Coast Press Leased Wire.)

Los Angeles, Oct. 10.—Alleged discrepancies between reports made by the Santa Fe officials and sworn testimony of such officials in the Santa Fe rebate case, taking of testimony in which was concluded yesterday, are to be investigated by the federal grand jury.

"If sufficient proof is obtained by the grand jury that the railroad officials swore falsely in the trial, indictments will be returned, charging them with perjury," said District Attorney Lawler today.

The grand jury venire has been summoned for October 17, at which time a date will be set for the meetings by the jurors then selected. This new development has added importance to the rebate case, as perjury indictments, if found, would affect individual officials, entailing possible imprisonment.
