WEATHER REPORT

Clear skies prevail over the greater portion of the country this morning owing to the presence of two immense high areas, the one covering the northwestern and the other the southeastern portion of the country. The first is of a pronounced character and first made its appearance this morning, having moved southeastward during the last week or four hours from upper Canada. Temperatures immediately in advance of this area are falling rapidly. The southeastern high is slowly moving off to the south Atlantic coast. The depression over Alberta yesterday morning has moved eastward to the Great Lakes. It is lacking in energy, a slight rise in temperature over the Dakotas and Manitoba being the only effect it produced. The disturbance over the southwest remains stationary. It retains considerable energy, general rains having occurred over California, southern Nevada and Arizona during the last twenty-four hours.

ASTORIA RAILROAD MAKES ANNUAL REPORT

(Special Dispatch to The Journal). Salem, Or., Oct. 17.—The annual report of the Astoria & Columbia River Railway company has been received at the office of the railroad commission. The following is a summary: Capital stock, authorized and outstanding, \$1,819,000; funded debt, authorized and outstanding, \$3,240,000; cash realized from funded debt, \$3,242,000; gross earnings from operation in past year, \$617,165.48; operating expenses, \$163,930.19; income from operation, \$253,175.16. Complaints on car shortage are still coming in. The latest is from the Leiland Lumber company of Leiland, Oregon, who have ordered five cars that they cannot get. They say that on occasions they have had to close their mill on account of the shortage of cars. Spike Kennedy's first fight on the coast will be with Young Peter Jackson.
