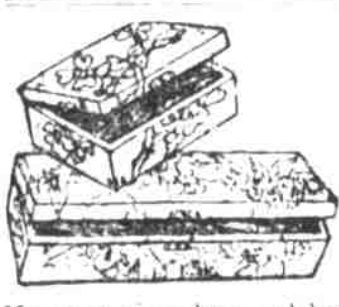

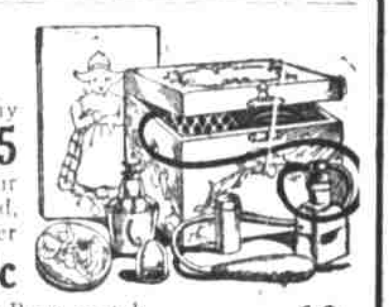

TO REMOVE BARS AT YAQUINA BAY

People at Toledo Ask Congressman Hawley to Assist Them in Project.

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.)
 Toledo, Oct. 24.—Congressman W. C. Hawley addressed the people of Lincoln county at the courthouse in Toledo Tuesday night. The meeting was held under the auspices of the Toledo Development league. Mr. Hawley, coming here on his invitation, in an address Mr. Hawley outlined the policy he intends to pursue during the coming session of congress, laying much stress upon the attitude he intends taking in public land matters.
 One particular project for which the Development league asked the assistance of Mr. Hawley and the other members of Oregon's delegation, was the dredging of the two bars in the Yaquina river between Toledo and the lower bay. These two bars impede the navigation of the river, and would also give the vessels a fresh water harbor. Mr. Hawley promised to use his best endeavors to have the government remove these bars. Wednesday a committee took Mr. Hawley up to the logging camps and showed him some of the logging operations, after which he was taken down the river in a boat to Newport. He will stay in Lincoln county until Friday.

SCULPTOR'S WOE DUE TO CAPITOL

Harrisburg Scandal Brings Trouble to Young William MacIntosh.

 Island Heights, N. J., Oct. 24.—William MacIntosh, who has brought several suits for \$15,000 following his eviction from a house he says he leased for two years, blames his troubles on the Harrisburg state capitol job. He was one of the unsuccessful aspirants for the sculpture contract.
 MacIntosh was a young sculptor in Philadelphia when the contracts for the capitol work were to be given out. Through some public maneuvering he had worked upon he had become acquainted with many of the Philadelphia leaders, and he was assured that he would get an opportunity to show his skill and his genius in the new building.
 Without waiting for contracts, but simply with blind faith in promises, the sculptor is said to have turned away commissions that were coming in, spending his savings in turning into the dust of the dream that came to him, and that he expected to be realized in the Harrisburg building.
 When a year or so had been spent in this work, it is alleged that he sold the contracts had been given to George Gray Barnard.
 Last April MacIntosh was evicted from the house he occupied. Then he brought the damage suits.

SUNDAY SCHOOLS CONVENTION CLOSED

 Roseburg, Or., Oct. 24.—Frank Smith, the young man who slashed "Bud" Martindale with a razor and who was convicted as charged of an assault with a dangerous weapon, was sentenced Wednesday morning to one year in the penitentiary. Smith is the young man who made a desperate attempt to escape from the officers as he was being escorted back to jail from the courtroom on Tuesday afternoon.

EUROPE GREET NEW MOVEMENT

Leader of Theosophists Is Warmly Received in the Countries Across Water.

From the many reports that are coming back across the Atlantic, it is evident that Mrs. Katherine Tingley, leader of the theosophist movement, upon whom the mantle of Madame Blavatsky has fallen, is meeting with marked success throughout northern Europe, whither she went some months ago in the interest of theosophy. Following a successful tour of England, where Mrs. Tingley made arrangements to establish a school in the New Forest on the magnificent estate which the Hon. Nat. Herbert has given for this purpose, she went to Sweden and was given an enthusiastic reception by a large number of her followers in the Scandinavian peninsula.
 She visited Stockholm, Helsingborg and Umea, where both private and public meetings were held, the latter taxing the capacity of the largest halls in the various cities.
 Visits Historic Island.
 Later she visited the island of Visitinga on which she purchased an estate for the location of another Raja Yoga school and university. This island is of historic interest from the fact that about 1645 Earl Per Brahe established a school there, which in many respects was similar to that which Mrs. Tingley is about to establish.
 Cable advice from Sweden says that Mrs. Tingley is contemplating an extensive tour of Finland, Norway and northern Russia. In the issue of September 19 the Svenska Dagbladet has the following to say of Mrs. Tingley's arrival and reception in that country: "Mrs. Tingley, the leader of the Universal Brotherhood and Theosophical society throughout the world, arrived yesterday in Stockholm, accompanied by some of her coworkers from Point Loma, California.
 Purpose of Visit Outlined.
 "The purpose of her visit is the establishment of Raja Yoga schools at Visitinga and other points in northern Europe. One of her first works here was the inauguration of the new Swedish headquarters in Stockholm. After the inauguration ceremonies she was greeted by different branches of the organization and by the pupils of the Lotus groups and the girls and boys' Brotherhood clubs, who sang songs and presented greetings.
 "While in England Mrs. Tingley had the following to say to a group of newspaper reporters:
 "My visit to Europe at the present time is the result, in part, of the work that has been going on for many years at the international center of theosophy, Point Loma, California.
 "During the 12 years that I have been identified with the organization, I have, following Madame Blavatsky and William Q. Judge, endeavored to make it a practical factor in daily life. To me the profession of theosophy is not enough. One must live it. Theosophy, to sum it up in a nutshell, is the science of life and the art of living."

BENJAMIN FAY MILLS GIVES FIRST LECTURE

Noted Evangelist Comes to Portland in Interests of Fellowship Movement.

Benjamin Fay Mills, better known in this city as B. Fay Mills, as his name was written when he came in 1892 as a revivalist for the Evangelical churches, is in Portland again, this time associated with what is known as the Fellowship movement. He lectured last night before a large audience in the Women of Woodcraft hall, explaining the principles of his new faith. He will present a series of addresses, to which admission is free, at 5 and 8 o'clock each day until Sunday in the Women of Woodcraft hall.
 His subject last night was "The Eve of a New Spiritual Era." His theme was the decadence of public and private

morality, but the trend underneath it that reveals an awakening he emphasized. He said the time for universal religion was at hand, and went to prove his statements by recent events not altogether in the United States but in India and Japan.
 Mr. Mills will speak this afternoon at 4 o'clock in the 24th-century business college at 2 o'clock in the morning on the subject, "Mixing Religion With Business." Tomorrow evening the subject will be, "What the World Never Knew Till Now."
