

RAILROAD TICKETS SOLD ON STREET



Crowd Waiting for Train on Fourth Street, Near Stark.

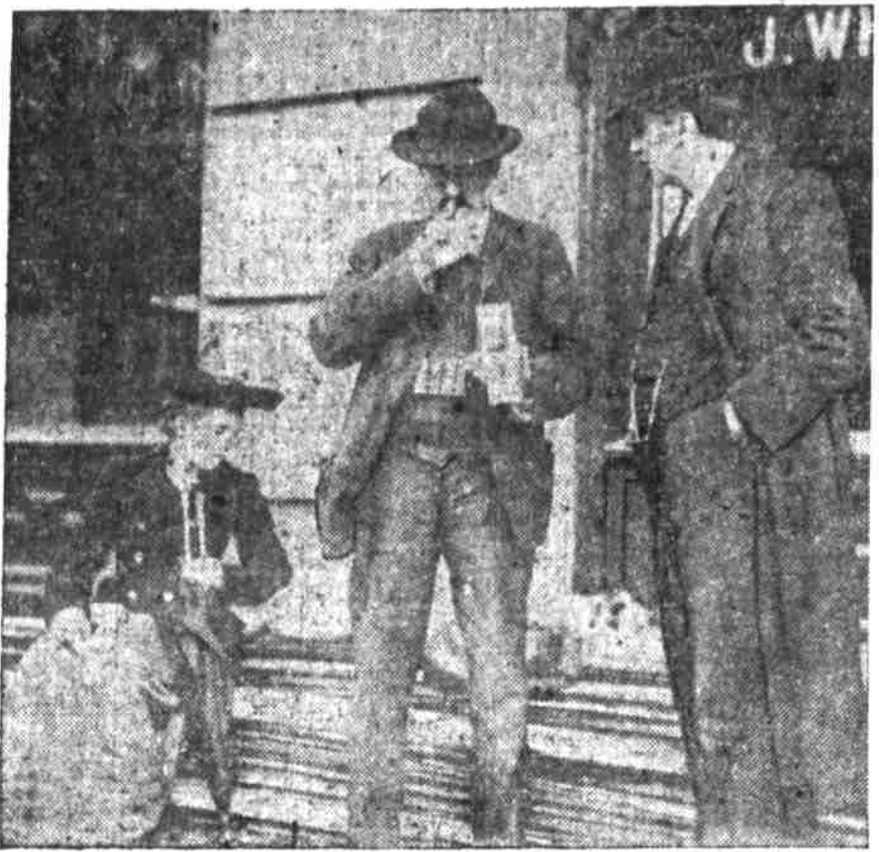
Portland and the west side division of the Southern Pacific have something which perhaps no other city or railroad company in the world possesses—a ticket agent without any office except the street and the train. James L. Slipp, agent of the line which runs out Fourth street, is the man.

In the days of yore Mr. Slipp used to have an office on the corner of Fourth and Oak, where the Board of Trade is now putting up its new building, but the former was torn down about his ears and he was turned out into the street to all practical intents and purposes. For a short time thereafter he was put in the southwest corner of the Chamber of Commerce building, but this office room became too valuable, and was taken over by Morris Brothers for their use.

Then Ticket Agent Slipp went out upon the street in reality as well as in theory, and now he can be seen standing on the sidewalk at Fourth street just before his two trains a day leave the city selling tickets for all points over the west side division. He is equipped with a little hand-satchel for his cash and tickets, carries a punch hooked about his little finger as all conductors do, and exchanges little slips of paper in exchange for coin of the realm.

"Why do I sell tickets on the street?" said Mr. Slipp yesterday afternoon. "Because I have no other place to sell them. I have no office and have not had since they tore it down over my head last April. Since then I have been selling tickets here before the trains leave and I sell more than are disposed of at the Union depot for the west side trains."

"People won't go down to the depot for their tickets, and so I sell them up here. If I don't sell them all I get on the train and sell them there. I go out on the morning train and again on the evening train, sell tickets to all those who did not get them either at the de-

pot or of me here and then come back on the next train into Portland. I am not required to sell them on the street, but do so in order to make the work on the train easier."

Business men having offices in the Chamber of Commerce building are beginning to make complaint of the four times a day congestion at the corner of Fourth and Stark, whenever a Fourth-street train come in or leave. All trains are halted at this place, those outgoing to allow the people to get aboard and those incoming to permit the passengers to detrain.

Twice each day the sidewalk in front of the Fourth-street entrance to the Chamber of Commerce building is blocked with passengers waiting for their train or for friends who are expected to arrive. The business men say this interferes with their work and their clients. Teamsters, too, are complaining because the trains stop across Stark street, blocking the traffic on that street four times a day. The company says the trains stop there because the people expect them to and will not go to the Union depot to get aboard as they do for all other trains leaving the city.

SUSPECTED TRIO TO STAND TRIAL

Governor Buchtel Honors Requisitions for Alleged Penney Murderers.

Denver, Col., Oct. 30. — Governor Buchtel has honored requisitions by the governor of Utah for Mrs. Mary Armstrong, George Harper and John Harper, charged with the murder of Ezra Penney and his son George near Salt Lake City eight years ago. Penney and his son drove from home in a camping outfit. Some days later the outfit was found in possession of the trio. They were arrested, but released without trial as a search for the bodies proved fruitless. Last week a body of prospectors came upon the two skeletons a few miles out of Salt Lake City. The daughter of Penney, who never lost hope for vengeance, immediately went to the spot and identified one skeleton as that of her father because of a peculiar filling in one tooth. The decomposed parts of an Indian blanket were also identified. Bullet holes in the skulls showed that both had been murdered. The detectives located the trio first suspected in Denver and vicinity and placed them under arrest. They claim to be able to prove their innocence.

THREE OF A FAMILY SENT TO ASYLUM

The Dalles, Or., Oct. 30. — It is seldom that three children of the same family are committed to the state insane asylum, but such was the case of three poor unfortunates who have made their home near Antelope. They are John, Ida and Flora Caldwell, who are said to have been unsound mentally from birth. While the three were not particularly dangerous, yet it would be best to have them sent to the hospital where they could be given proper care and treatment. John is about 30 years of age and Ida and Flora are, respectively, 28 and about 30.

University of Oregon, Eugene, Oct. 30. —The Oregon State High School Debating league, organized during the past summer, is meeting with hearty cooperation from all parts of the state. Fifteen of the larger schools have already signified their intention of joining the league, including Pendleton, Baker City, La Grande, Ontario, The Dalles, Astoria, Salem, Eugene, Roseburg, Klamath Falls, Medford, Grants Pass, Bandon, Marshfield, North Bend, and a number of smaller ones. On account of the reorganization of its high schools, Portland was not able to enter, but will do so next year. The state has been divided into four districts, and a championship team will be chosen from each district. The final debate will be held at the University of Oregon. A handsome silver cup will be given to the winning team.
