# SAILOR RETURNS TO INHERIT FORTUNE

Vessels Arrive After Tedious Tows Up the River Through Dense Banks of Fog—Both Bring Cargoes. Coming here from Newcastle, Australia, the British ship Claverdon ran into a storm that tore several sails from the sticks. It was encountered in mid-ocean and lasted for nearly a week. It took the Claverdon 65 days to make the run from Australia and beat the entire fleet that left the port for the Pacific when she sailed. Among these vessels was the British ship St. Mirren, which is now due to arrive here. Sailed on the Claverdon was the St. Mirren, which had begun her voyage. When in the vicinity of the Society Islands the Claverdon passed the French bark Marchael de Turrene, which arrived in the harbor here this morning from Hobart, Tasmania.

Among the crew of the Claverdon is Frank A. S. T. Smith, who says his home is in Salem, this state. The man with the aristocratic initials tells he has sailed for 20 years, in all capacities from deck boy to captain and down again. He recanted the berth of second boatman on the Claverdon because he wanted to come here to take charge of a farm he is recently inherited from a distant relative, saying Salem says he is going to try to make the farm keep him off the sea for the balance of his days, although he thinks it will be difficult. The French bark Marchael de Turrene, which reached the harbor this afternoon, is in command of Captain Schwaner, a master of the old school. She is a big carrier having capacity for 4,000 tons of cargo, is somewhat familiar here since she took a cargo of lumber from this river to the Orient a few months ago, the cargo a white crew, contrary to the usual order of things on steamers in the Pacific ocean trade.

# HIDDEN IN FOG

German Steamship Has Strange Experience Off River. The British steamer British Monarch and the American steamer Roanoke kept the Tiberius company for 14 hours. The Tiberius arrived up in the harbor shortly before noon today. She dropped anchor in the stream, but later in the afternoon Pilot Emker hauled her into the Montgomery dock where she will remain while being lined for her cargo. Kelly, Gifford & Co. chartered the steamer several weeks ago and she will be loaded at Montgomery dock, No. 2, with a full cargo of wheat.
