U.S. GOVERNMENT INSPECTED MEATS

HOW TO BUY A CHOICE BEEF ROAST

First, go to a shop that you know carries Government Inspected meat, and insist that only this safe, wholesome food is supplied you. Then select a prime rib roast; the meat should be smooth, fine grained, of a clear bright red with plenty of fine white fat.

HOW TO COOK IT MAKES A DELICIOUS 'SUNDAY DINNER'

The most wholesome, tender meat can be rendered unpalatable and indigestible by improper cooking. The first thing is to put slices of suet or beef fat in the roasting pan and heat smoking hot. Then lay the roast in the hot fat and sear on both sides quickly, imprisoning the juices. Thrust it into a hot oven, lay a good-sized piece of beef fat on top of the roast while it is cooking and baste frequently. When proved tender by trial with a fork, it is done. White or sweet potatoes roasted in the drippings, about the beef, will prove a tasty addition.
