

RUSH WORK ON WEED RAILROAD

Money Stringency Fails to Affect Harriman's Corraling Project in Klamath.

From Weed to Dorris, 63 miles, the California & Northeastern railroad, an extension of the Southern Pacific through Klamath county, is completed.

Long before this road is continued to a connection with the Natron terminus of the present line from Portland, the trade of Klamath county will have been appropriated by San Francisco if something is not done to counteract the results of the Harriman policy in the building of the Klamath extension north from Weed instead of south from Natron.

Dorris has a boom, and town lots are selling fast. Dorris will try to divert the retail trade from every town within 20 miles.

Construction is making rapid progress between Hay and Mount Hebron, and trains are expected to run into the latter place before the first of the year.

It is reported that at Midland eastern capitalists are soon to develop the land in that region justifies such an industry. The lands are especially adapted to the production of sugar beets.
